# NAM Key Manufacturing Votes: U.S. House of Representatives, 113th Congress

- 1) Cyber Intelligence Sharing and Protection Act (CISPA).** Vote on H.R. 624, CISPA. Approved 288-127 on April 18, 2013 (Roll No. 117). The NAM supported the bill, which would allow the government to share timely information related to cyber attacks to the business community and create new liability protections so that companies can share cybersecurity information with the government or their peers.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 2) Repeal of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.** Vote on H.R. 45, legislation that would repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and health-related provisions in the 2010 Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act. Approved 229-195 on May 16, 2013 (Roll No. 154). The NAM supported the legislation, reiterating that the 2010 health care legislation will drive up manufacturers' health care costs.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 3) Keystone XL Export Ban Amendment.** Vote on a Holt (D-NJ-12) amendment that would have banned the export of crude oil or petroleum products derived from crude oil transported by the Keystone XL pipeline. Rejected 162-255 on May 22, 2013 (Roll No. 177). The NAM opposed the amendment, noting that manufacturers oppose market-distorting barriers to exports.  
**NAM POSITION: No.**
- 4) Northern Route Approval Act.** Vote on H.R. 3, the Northern Route Approval Act, legislation designed to speed approval of the Keystone XL pipeline. Approved 241-175 on May 22, 2013 (Roll No. 179). The NAM supported the bill, noting that construction of the pipeline is critical for U.S. energy policy and economic growth.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 5) Farm Bill Sugar Amendment.** Vote on a Pitts (R-PA-16) amendment to the Farm Bill that would reform parts of the U.S. sugar program that inflate the domestic cost of sugar and harm the global competitiveness of U.S. food manufacturers. Rejected 206-221 on June 20, 2013 (Roll No. 281). The NAM supported the amendment, which would alleviate trade restrictions that limit the supply of sugar to domestic users and reduce government-imposed costs on both manufacturers and consumers.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 6) Offshore Energy and Jobs Act.** Vote on H.R. 2231, the Offshore Energy and Jobs Act. Approved 235-186 on June 28, 2013 (Roll No. 304). The NAM supported the bill, which would significantly expand areas in the Outer Continental Shelf available for responsible oil/gas development, which, in turn, could substantially increase U.S. energy supply, lower energy costs for manufacturers and grow jobs.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 7) Authority for Mandate Delay Act.** Vote on H.R. 2667, the Authority for Mandate Delay Act. Approved 264-161 on July 17, 2013 (Roll No. 361). The NAM supported the bill, which delays until 2015 enforcement of the employer mandate under the 2010 Affordable Care Act.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 8) Coal Residuals Reuse and Management Act.** Vote on H.R. 2218, the Coal Residuals Reuse and Management Act. Approved 265-155 on July 25, 2013 (Roll No. 418). The NAM supported the bill, which would ensure the safe regulation of coal ash in a cost-effective manner, while protecting public health, the environment and thousands of high-paying jobs.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 9) Energy Consumers Relief Act.** Vote on H.R. 1582, the Energy Consumers Relief Act. Approved 232-181 on August 1, 2013 (Roll No. 432). The NAM supported the bill, which would require the EPA—before finalizing rules estimated to cost more than \$1 billion—to submit a report to Congress projecting energy cost increases and the effects on U.S. employment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 10) Furthering Asbestos Claim Transparency (FACT) Act.** Vote on H.R. 982, the FACT Act. Approved 221-199 on November 13, 2013 (Roll No. 579). The NAM supported the bill, which would require quarterly public disclosure of payments made by asbestos trust funds in order to reduce fraud.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 11) Lawsuit Abuse Reduction Act.** Vote on H.R. 2655, the Lawsuit Abuse Reduction Act. Approved 228-195 on November 14, 2013 (Roll No. 581). The NAM supported the bill, which would restore several disincentives for filing frivolous lawsuits in federal court.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 12) Natural Gas Export Ban Amendment.** Vote on a DeFazio (D-OR-4) amendment to H.R. 2728 that would have banned the export of natural gas extracted from federal lands. Rejected 142-276 on November 20, 2013 (Roll No. 602). The NAM opposed the amendment, noting that manufacturers oppose market-distorting barriers to exports.  
**NAM POSITION: No.**
- 13) Protecting States' Rights to Promote American Energy Security Act.** Vote on H.R. 2728, the Protecting States' Rights to Promote American Energy Security Act. Approved 235-187 on November 20, 2013 (Roll No. 604). The NAM supported the bill, which would prohibit the Department of the Interior from enforcing any federal regulation, guidance or permit requirement regarding oil, gas or geothermal activities, and would also require the Bureau of Land Management to instead defer to existing state regulation.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

## NAM Key Manufacturing Votes: U.S. House of Representatives, 113th Congress *continued*

- 14) Natural Gas Pipeline Permitting Reform Act.** Vote on H.R. 1900, the Natural Gas Pipeline Permitting Reform Act. Approved 252-165 on November 21, 2013 (Roll No. 611). The NAM supported the bill, which would streamline the permitting process for natural gas pipelines and strengthen our energy infrastructure to accommodate increased domestic production and use of natural gas in manufacturing and other sectors.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 15) Stop Targeting of Political Beliefs by the IRS Act.** Vote on H.R. 3865, the Stop Targeting of Political Beliefs by the IRS Act. Approved 243-176 on February 26, 2014 (Roll No. 69). The NAM supported the bill because it would halt an overreaching IRS regulation that targets political activities guaranteed under the First Amendment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 16) Achieving Less Excess in Regulation and Requiring Transparency (ALERRT) Act.** Vote on H.R. 2804, the ALERRT Act. Approved 236-179 on February 27, 2014 (Roll No. 78). The NAM supported the bill because it is a comprehensive regulatory reform package that would codify sound regulatory principles, including cost-benefit analysis, expand judicial review, close loopholes that enable agencies to avoid conducting a small business impact analysis and require transparency and public comment for regulatory decrees and settlements (i.e., sue and settle).  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 17) Energy Efficiency Improvement Act.** Vote on H.R. 2126, the Energy Efficiency Improvement Act. Approved 375-36 on March 5, 2014 (Roll No. 98). The NAM supported the bill, which would improve energy efficiency in commercial, residential and federal government-owned buildings.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 18) Electricity Security and Affordability Act.** Vote on H.R. 3826, the Electricity Security and Affordability Act. Approved 229-183 on March 6, 2014 (Roll No. 106). The NAM supported the bill because it would improve the EPA's greenhouse gas regulatory agenda by protecting a diverse energy mix critical to manufacturers.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 19) Responsibly and Professionally Invigorating Development (RAPID) Act.** Vote on H.R. 2641, the RAPID Act. Approved 229-179 on March 6, 2014 (Roll No. 113). The NAM supported the measure because it would greatly improve the environmental permitting process for infrastructure projects through commonsense changes like concurrent (rather than serial) environmental reviews, increased cooperation among federal agencies and reasonable deadlines for parties to file comments and legal challenges.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 20) American Research and Competitiveness Act.** Vote on H.R. 4438, the American Research and Competitiveness Act. Approved 274-131 on May 9, 2014 (Roll No. 211). The NAM supported the bill because it provides a strengthened, permanent R&D credit that is retroactive to the beginning of 2014, allowing the United States to remain competitive in the global race for R&D investment dollars and a leader in global innovation.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 21) Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA).** Vote on the conference report to H.R. 3080, WRRDA. Approved 412-4 on May 20, 2014 (Roll No. 220). Signed into law (P.L. 113-121) on June 10, 2014. The NAM supported the conference report because it enables continued federal investment in our nation's inland and coastal waterways and begins critical reforms that will enhance delivery of key infrastructure projects.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 22) America's Small Business Tax Relief Act.** Vote on H.R. 4457, America's Small Business Tax Relief Act. Approved 272-144 on June 12, 2014 (Roll No. 309). The NAM supported the bill because it provides strengthened, permanent enhanced Section 179 expensing provisions that are retroactive to the beginning of 2014, which will reduce the after-tax cost of investments and help spur much-needed investments in new property and sales of capital equipment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 23) Domestic Prosperity and Global Freedom Act.** Vote on H.R. 6, the Domestic Prosperity and Global Freedom Act. Approved 266-150 on June 25, 2014 (Roll No. 359). The NAM supported the bill because it ensures that market forces govern international trade by providing a 30-day deadline for the Department of Energy to approve or deny pending liquefied natural gas (LNG) export applications.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

**24) Lowering Gasoline Prices to Fuel an America That Works Act.** Vote on H.R. 4899, the Lowering Gasoline Prices to Fuel an America That Works Act. Approved 229-185 on June 26, 2014 (Roll No. 368). The NAM supported the bill because it puts in place a comprehensive plan to explore and develop our onshore and offshore energy resources, an essential commitment to maximizing the U.S. competitive advantage on energy.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

**25) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.** Vote on the Senate amendment to H.R. 803, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. Approved 415-6 on July 9, 2014 (Roll No. 378). Signed into law (P.L. 113-128) on July 22, 2014. The NAM supported the legislation because it prioritizes federal skills training resources toward portable, certified skills, which will help provide manufacturers with the skilled workforce they need to compete successfully in the global environment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

**26) Legislation to Make Bonus Depreciation Permanent.** Vote on H.R. 4718, legislation to make permanent 50 percent expensing, also known as “bonus depreciation.” Approved 258-160 on July 11, 2014 (Roll No. 404). The NAM supported the legislation because it allows manufacturers to write off 50 percent of their investment in the first year, lowers the after-tax cost of capital, increases the number of profitable projects a firm can undertake and directly spurs growth in business investment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

**27) Amendment to Stop Proposed Rule on Voluntary Recalls.** Vote on a Blackburn (R-TN-7) amendment to H.R. 5016, the Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act. Approved 229-194 on July 16, 2014 (Roll No. 424). The NAM supported the legislation because it would stop the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission from proceeding with a rule that harms the voluntary recall process for consumer products.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

**28) Highway and Transportation Funding Act.** Vote on the conference report to H.R. 5021, the Highway and Transportation Funding Act. Approved 272-150 on July 31, 2014 (Roll No. 473). Signed into law (P.L. 113-159) on August 8, 2014. The NAM supported the legislation because funding our roads, bridges and transit systems is a national priority, and it drives economic growth, jobs and increased competitiveness.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

**29) Waters of the United States Regulatory Overreach Protection Act.** Vote on H.R. 5078, the Waters of the United States Regulatory Overreach Protection Act. Approved 262-152 on September 9, 2014 (Roll No. 489). The NAM supported the bill because it opposes overly broad interpretations of the term “waters of the United States” and believes the term should mean waters that are considered navigable or that have a relatively permanent navigable surface connection to water.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**

# NAM Key Manufacturing Votes: U.S. Senate, 113th Congress

- 1) Senate Budget Resolution Amendment.** Vote on a Grassley (R-IA), Enzi (R-WY) and McConnell (R-KY) amendment to S.Con. Res. 8, the Senate Budget Resolution, which would create a deficit-neutral reserve fund and eliminate requirements in the bill directing the Senate Finance Committee to raise \$1 trillion in new revenues. Rejected 45-54 on March 21, 2013 (Roll No. 49). The NAM supported the amendment, noting that its passage would allow Congress to advance pro-growth, revenue-neutral comprehensive tax reform that would spur job creation and investment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 2) Farm Bill Sugar Amendment.** Vote on a Shaheen (D-NH) and Toomey (R-PA) amendment to S. 954, the Farm Bill, which would reform parts of the U.S. sugar program that inflate the domestic cost of sugar and harm the global competitiveness of U.S. food manufacturers. Rejected 45-54 on May 22, 2013 (Roll No. 134). The NAM supported the amendment, which would alleviate trade restrictions that limit the supply of sugar to domestic users and reduce government-imposed costs on both manufacturers and consumers.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 3) Border Security, Economic Opportunity and Immigration Modernization Act.** Vote on S. 744, the Border Security, Economic Opportunity and Immigration Modernization Act. Approved 68-32 on June 27, 2013 (Roll No. 168). The NAM supported the bill, noting that the U.S. immigration system is broken and that the legislation contains reforms that would enhance flexibility and allow for temporary workers and immigrants to meet the needs of the economy without displacing American workers or creating undue liability for employers, including changes to the method of determining the number of employment-based visas to meet market demands, updating the employment-based green card system to keep talent within the United States and streamlining procedures for temporary or non-immigrant visas.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 4) The Paycheck Fairness Act.** Procedural vote on S. 2199, the Paycheck Fairness Act. Rejected 53-44, 7 votes shy of the 60 votes required under Senate rules, on April 9, 2014 (Roll No. 103). The NAM opposed the bill, which would remove all limits to punitive and compensatory damage awards on claims made under the Equal Pay Act, exposing employers to increased litigation threats, increased legal liability insurance costs and limited ability to raise wages and benefits or hire new workers.  
**NAM POSITION: No.**
- 5) The Minimum Wage Fairness Act.** Procedural vote on S. 2223, the Minimum Wage Fairness Act. Rejected 54-42, 6 votes shy of the 60 votes required under Senate rules, on April 30, 2014 (Roll No. 117). The NAM opposed the bill, which would raise the minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$10.10 because it would be detrimental to job creation and, according to the Congressional Budget Office, could result in a loss of employment of 500,000 by the second half of 2016.  
**NAM POSITION: No.**
- 6) Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA).** Vote on the conference report to H.R. 3080, WRRDA. Approved 91-7 on May 22, 2014 (Roll No. 163). Signed into law (P.L. 113-121) on June 10, 2014. The NAM supported the conference report because it enables continued federal investment in our nation's inland and coastal waterways and begins critical reforms that will enhance delivery of key infrastructure projects.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 7) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.** Vote on the substitute amendment to H.R. 803, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. Approved 95-3 on June 25, 2014 (Roll No. 214). Signed into law (P.L. 113-128) on July 22, 2014. The NAM supported the substitute amendment because it prioritizes federal skills training resources toward portable, certified skills, which will help provide manufacturers with the skilled workforce they need to compete successfully in the global environment.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 8) Highway and Transportation Funding Act.** Vote on the conference report to H.R. 5021, the Highway and Transportation Funding Act. Approved 81-13 on July 31, 2014 (Roll No. 255). Signed into law (P.L. 113-159) on August 8, 2014. The NAM supported the legislation because funding our roads, bridges and transit systems is a national priority, and it drives economic growth, jobs and increased competitiveness.  
**NAM POSITION: Yes.**
- 9) Proposed Amendment to the Constitution of the United States to Limit Campaign Contributions and Expenditures.** Vote on S.J. Res. 19, a proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to contributions and expenditures intended to affect elections. Rejected 54-42, 6 votes shy of the 60 votes required under Senate rules, on September 11, 2014 (Roll No. 261). The NAM opposed the amendment because it would place limits on rights guaranteed by the First Amendment by providing unlimited authority to Congress and state governments to regulate political spending and activity.

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# The NAM Award for Manufacturing Legislative Excellence

The National Association of Manufacturers (NAM) formally recognizes members of Congress who consistently supported the manufacturing community during the 113th Congress (2013–2014). U.S. senators and representatives maintaining a 70 percent or better voting record on designated Key Manufacturing Votes are winners of the *NAM Award for Manufacturing Legislative Excellence*.

Each vote was selected by executives from small, medium and large manufacturing firms along with members of the Council of Manufacturing Associations serving on the NAM's Key Vote Advisory Committee (KVAC). Working in close coordination with NAM staff, the KVAC used the following guidelines in selecting votes:

- Votes must be on issues on which the NAM took clear positions and either: a) expressed this position in communications to Congress prior to the vote; or b) communicated our position to Congress with regularity in the recent past.
- Votes must be recorded floor votes. Voice votes, committee/subcommittee votes and conference committee votes will not be considered.

- Votes should be substantive. Procedural votes should be used only in cases where they are a true measure of support or opposition to the bill.
- Votes may be on final passage or on key amendments.

The NAM is nonpartisan and does not endorse candidates. The NAM aggressively seeks to influence the terms of public policy debates, to reward members of Congress who have supported our agenda and to inform those who have been on the wrong side of the issues that are important to manufacturers and workers in America.

We encourage NAM members to publicly thank winners of the *NAM Award for Manufacturing Legislative Excellence* (recognized in the publication in boldface) for their support of pro-growth, pro-manufacturing policies.
