

# District of Columbia Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in District of Columbia account for 0.20 percent of the total output in the state, employing 0.09 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$0.23 billion in 2013. In addition, there were 700 manufacturing employees in District of Columbia in 2014, with an average annual compensation of \$79,022 in 2013.

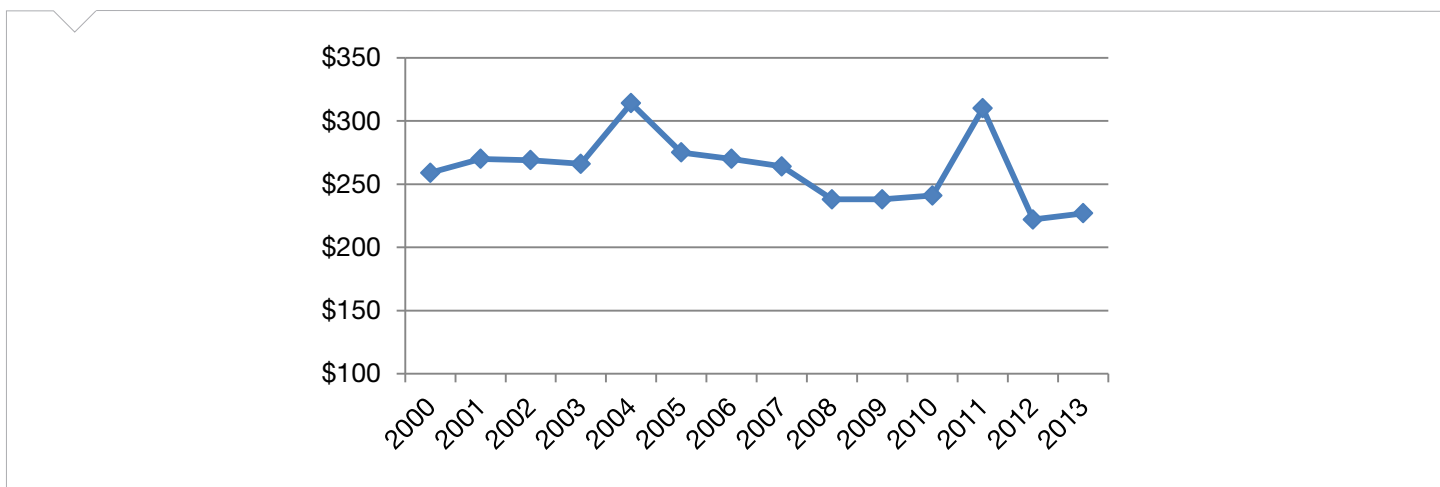

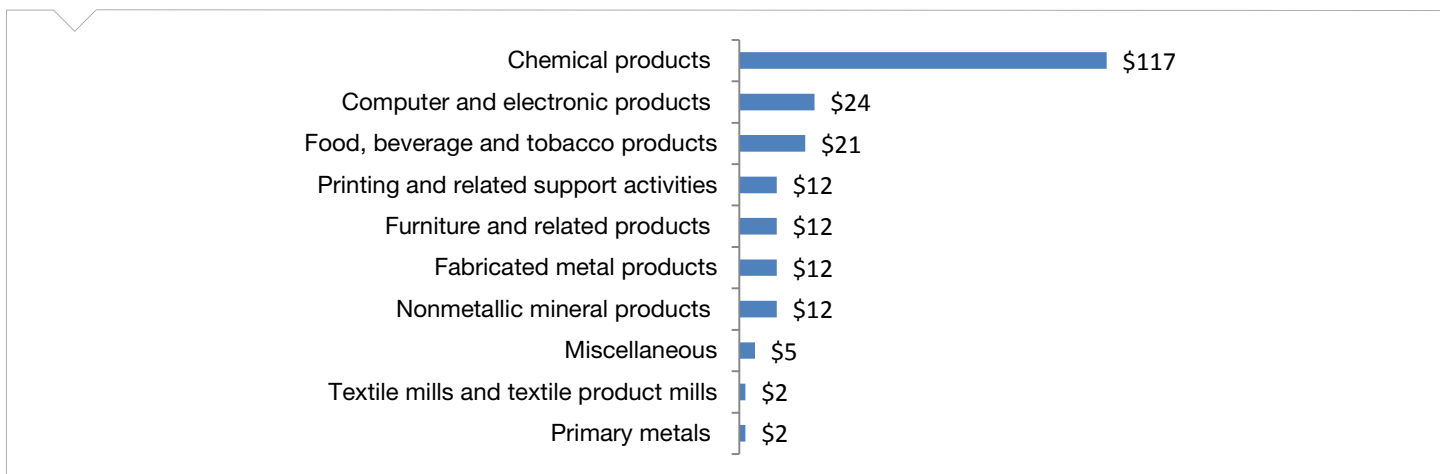

# District of Columbia Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive District of Columbia's economy, with \$0.84 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2014. That same year, \$0.12 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners.

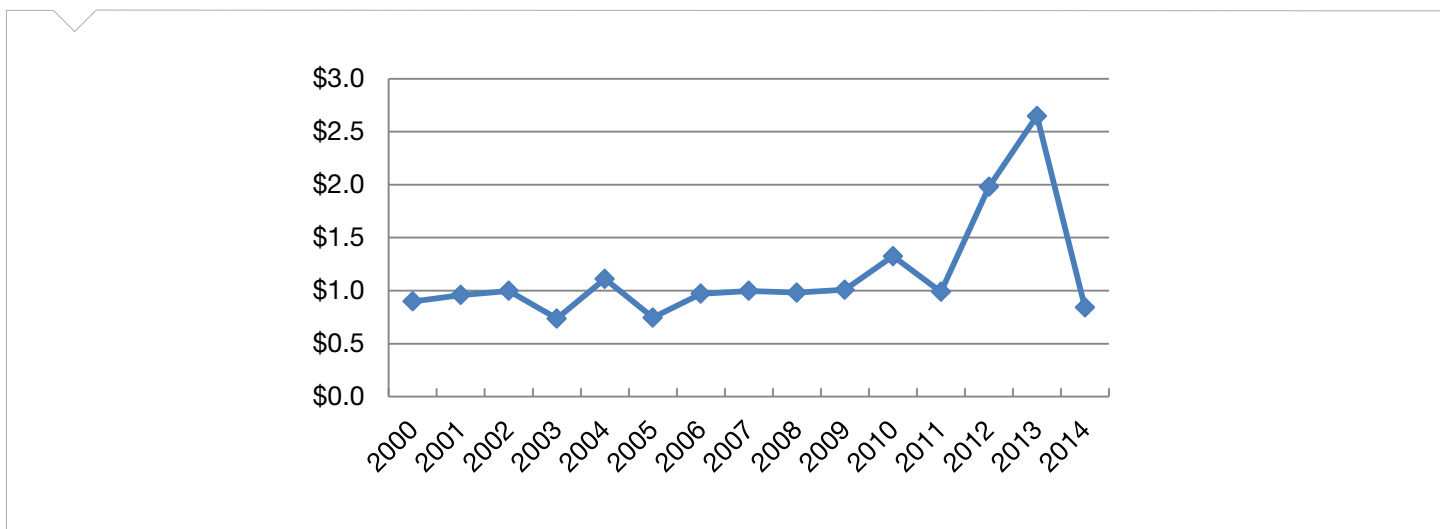

## Additional Trade Facts

- In 2014, manufacturers in the United States sold \$55.0 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$579.2 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
