

# Washington Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Washington account for 14.40 percent of the total output in the state, employing 9.34 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$58.76 billion in 2013. In addition, there were 289,100 manufacturing employees in Washington in 2014, with an average annual compensation of \$84,447 in 2013.

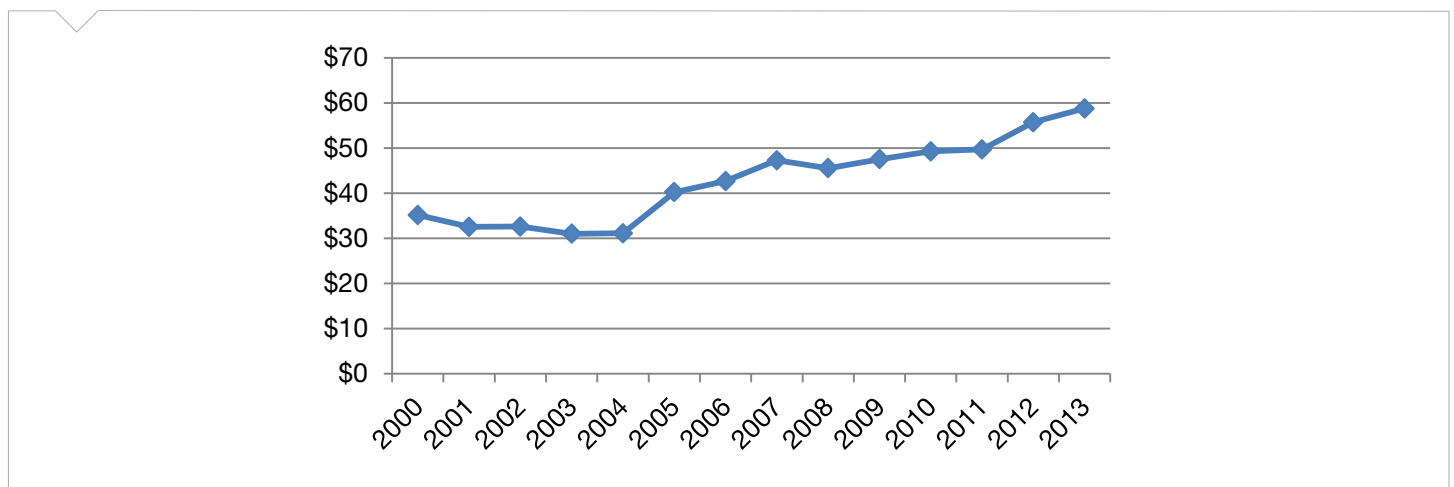

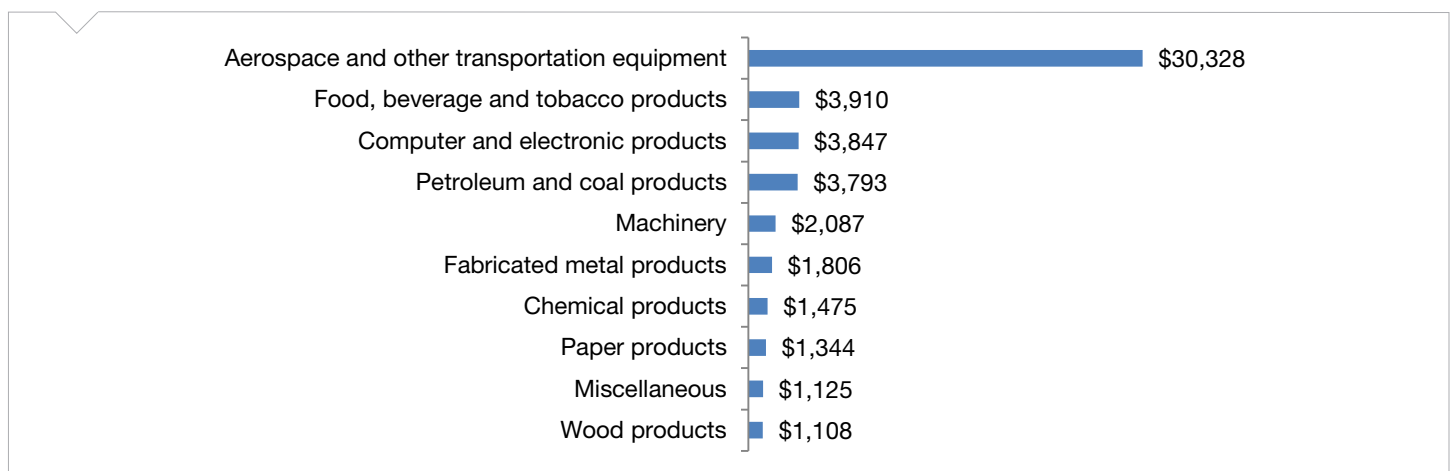

**Figure 2:** Top 10 Washington Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2012



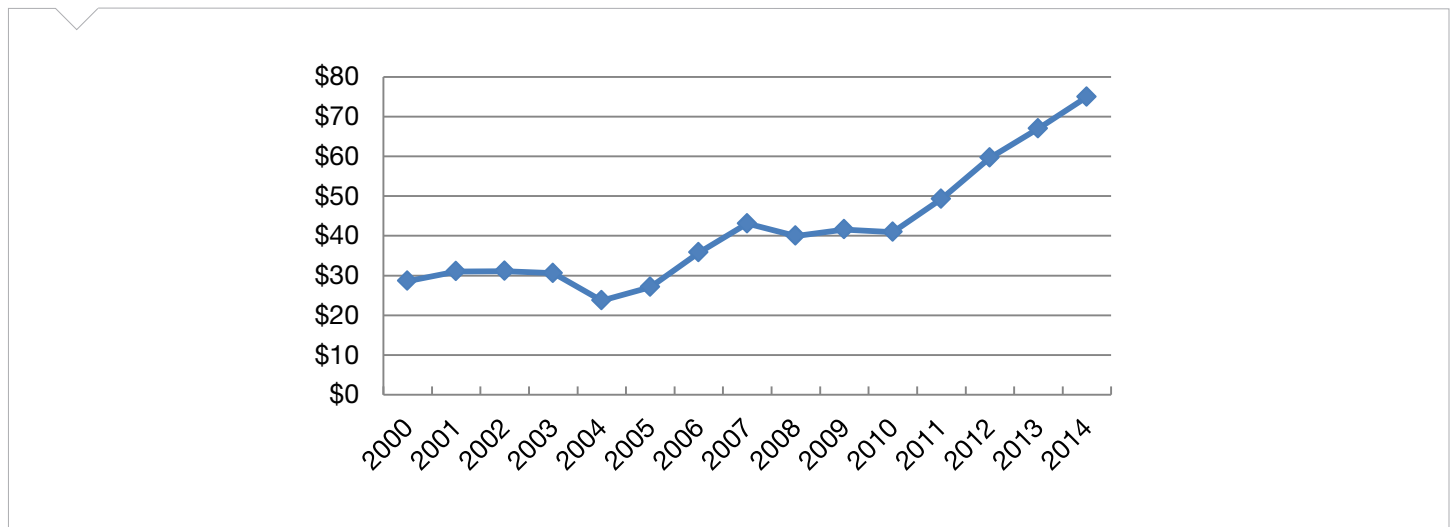
# Washington Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Washington's economy, with \$74.98 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2014. That same year, \$18.96 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 38.80 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 90.00 percent of all exporters in Washington.

## Additional Trade Facts

- In 2014, manufacturers in the United States sold \$55.0 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$579.2 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
