

West Virginia Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in West Virginia account for 9.73 percent of the total output in the state, employing 6.33 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$7.20 billion in 2013. In addition, there were 48,900 manufacturing employees in West Virginia in 2014, with an average annual compensation of \$65,653 in 2013.

Figure 1: West Virginia Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2000–2013

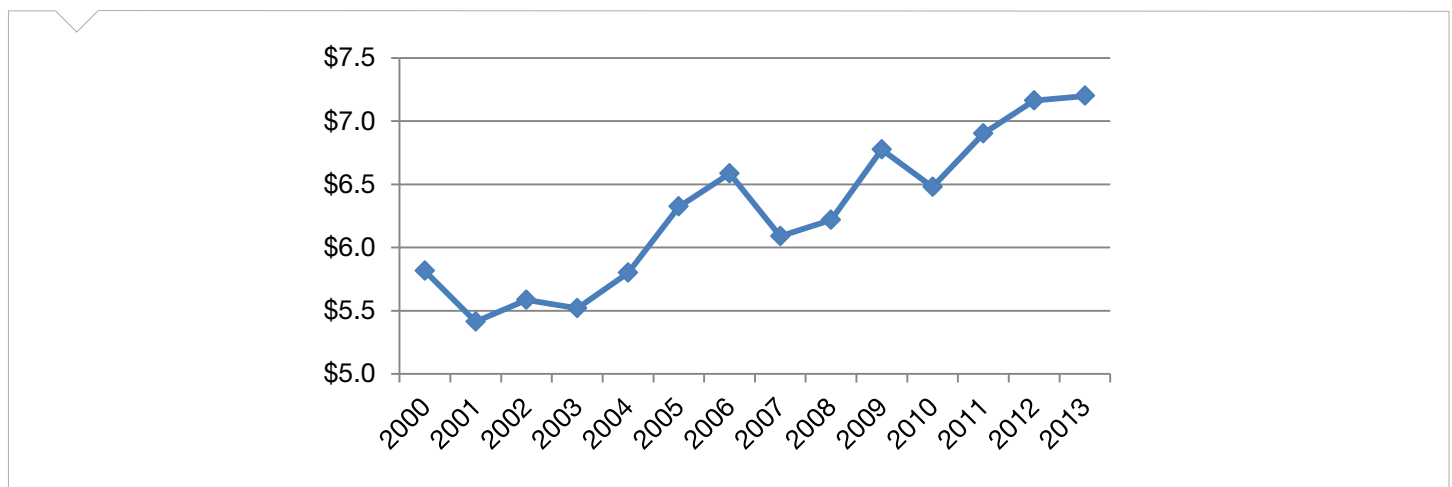
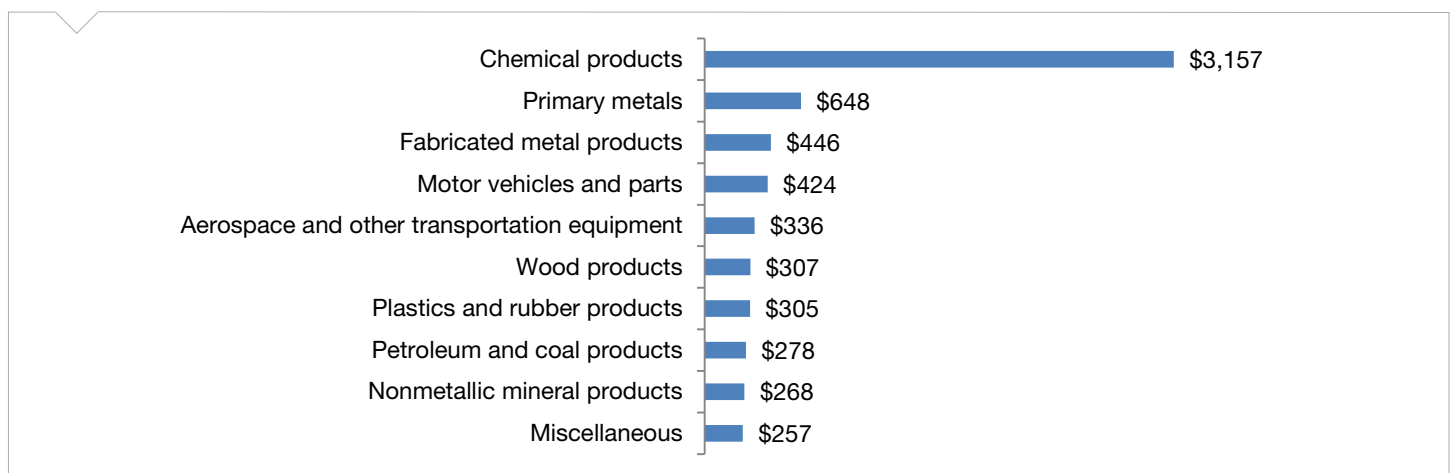


Figure 2: Top 10 West Virginia Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2012



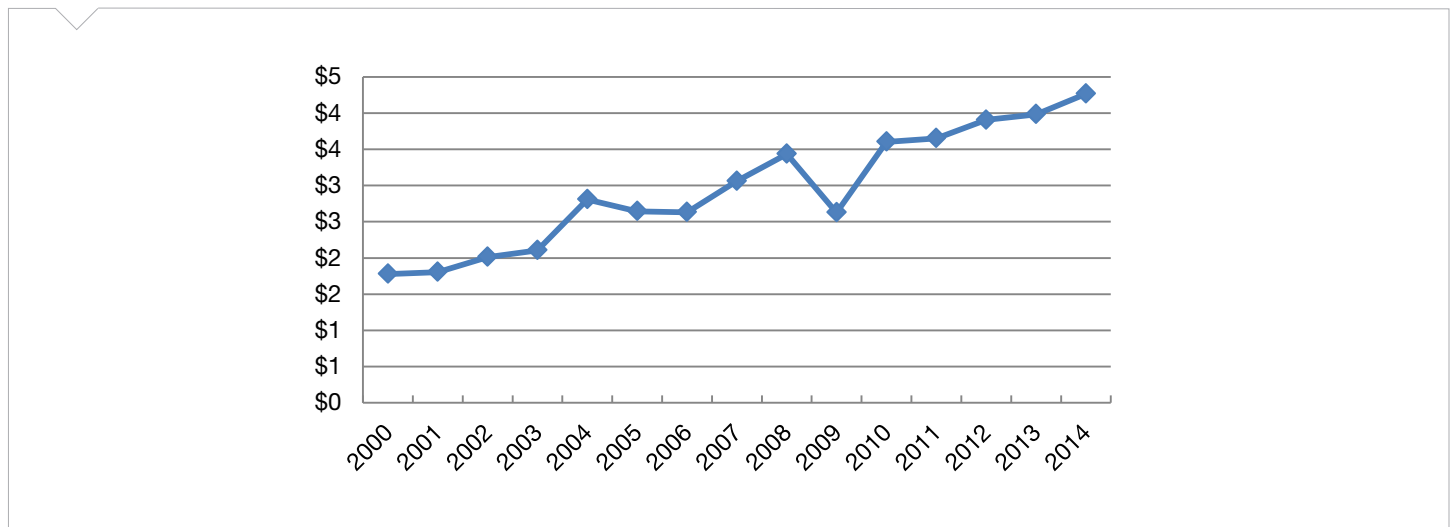
West Virginia Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive West Virginia's economy, with \$4.27 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2014. That same year, \$2.20 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 20.60 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 76.90 percent of all exporters in West Virginia.

- In 2014, manufacturers in the United States sold \$55.0 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$579.2 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
