

Washington Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Washington account for 13.12 percent of the total output in the state, employing 8.8 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$58.22 billion in 2015. In addition, there were 286,300 manufacturing employees in Washington in 2016, with an average annual compensation of \$86,991 in 2015.

Figure 1: Washington Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2015

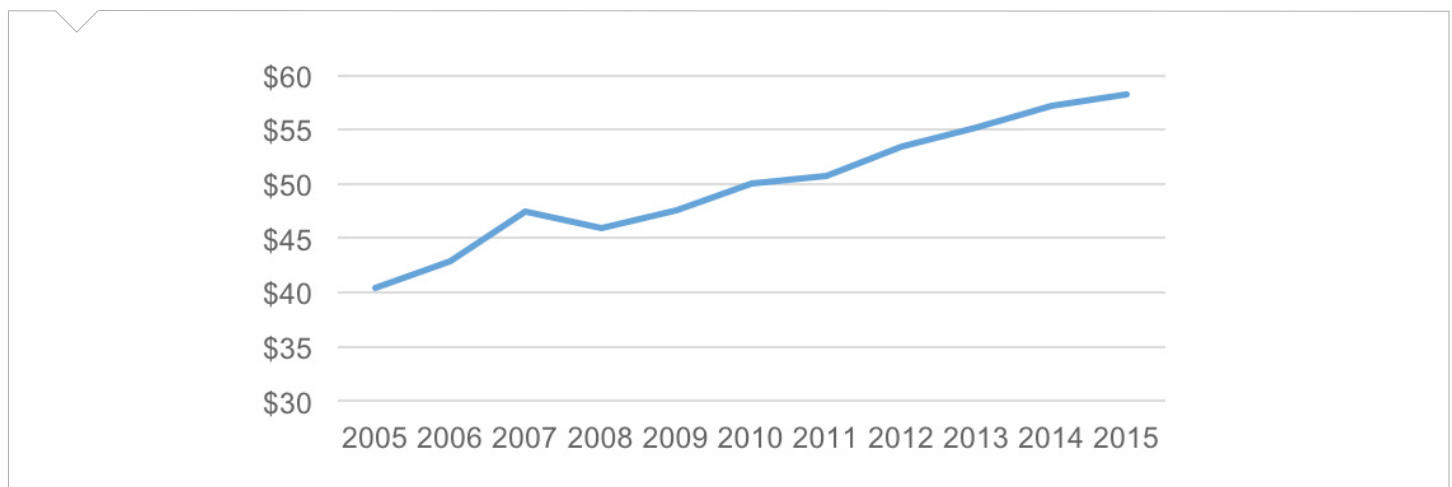
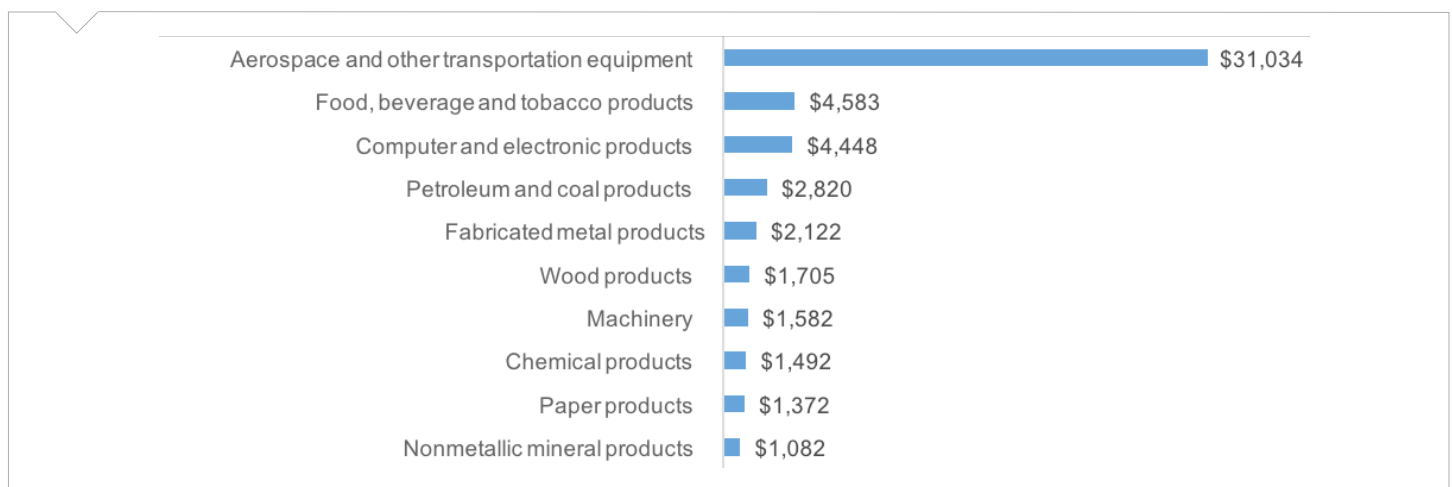


Figure 2: Top 10 Washington Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2014



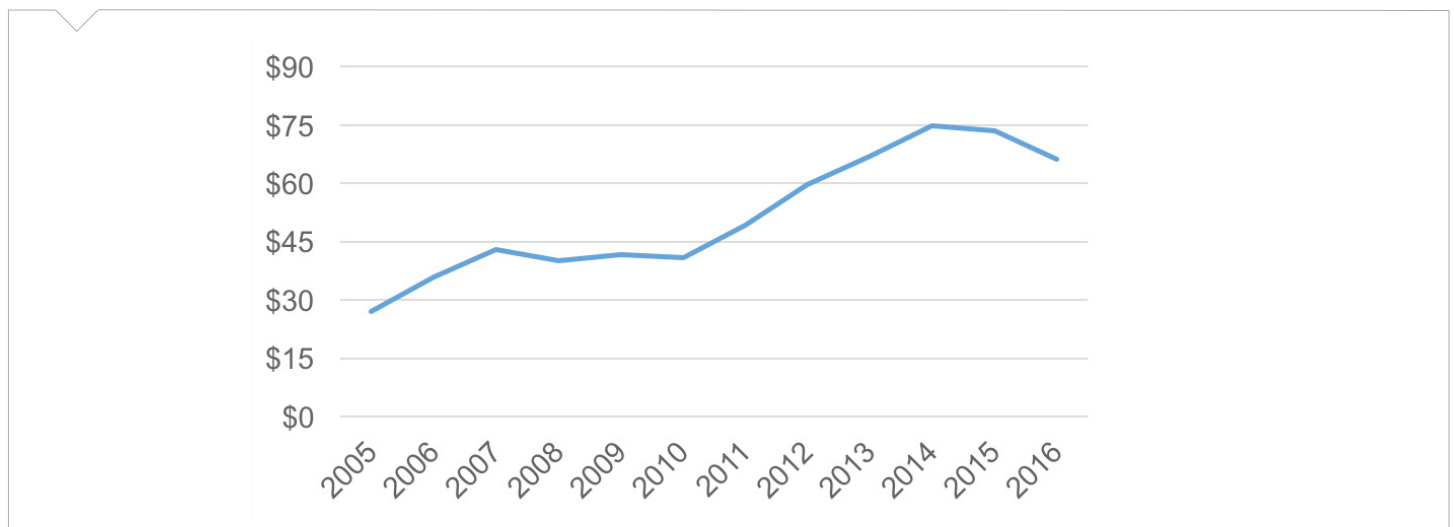
Washington Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Washington's economy, with \$66.22 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2016. That same year, \$14.87 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 38.80 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 90.0 percent of all exporters in Washington.

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$603 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2016 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
