

# Illinois Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Illinois account for 13.36 percent of the total output in the state, employing 9.69 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$99.67 billion in 2014. In addition, there were 573,700 manufacturing employees in Illinois in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$78,971 in 2013.

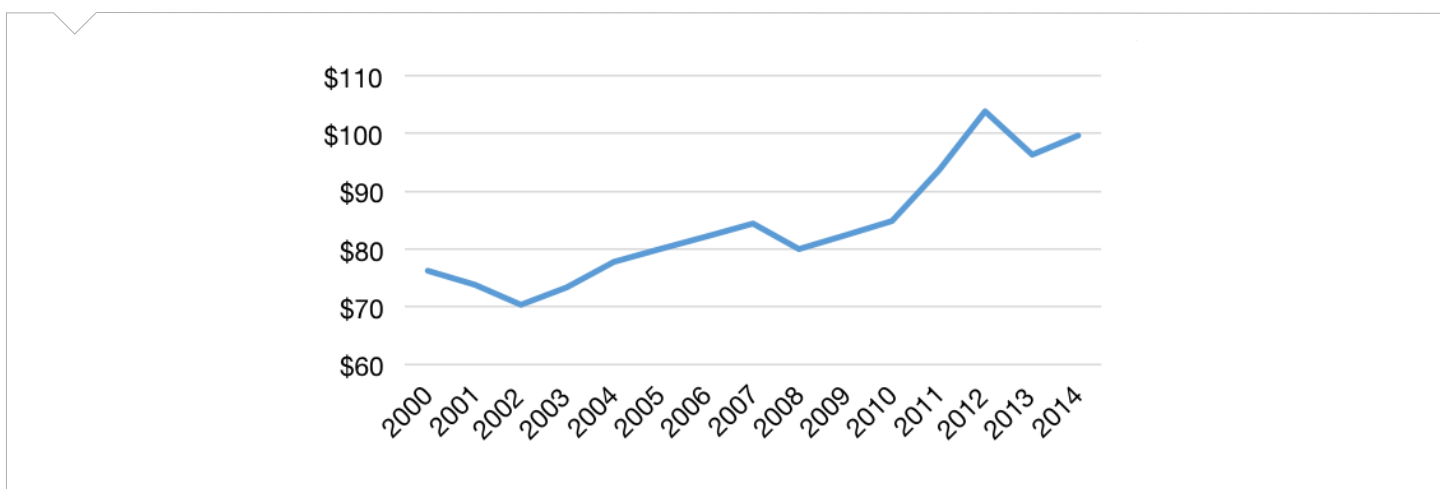

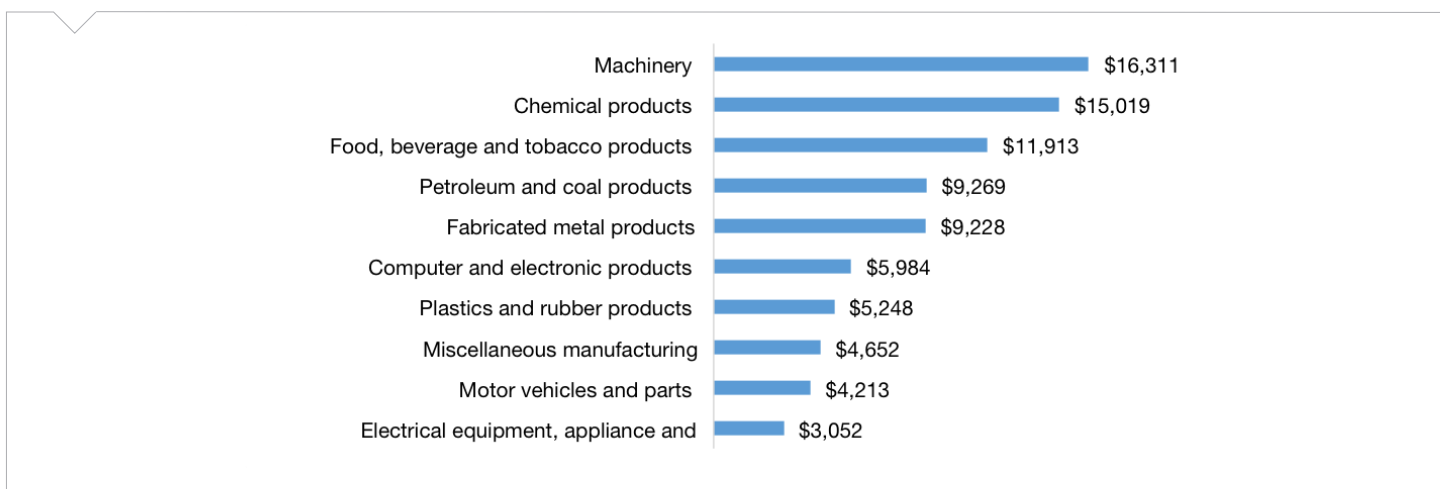

# Illinois Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Illinois's economy, with \$61.64 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2014. That same year, \$34.96 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 26.90% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 90 percent of all exporters in Illinois.

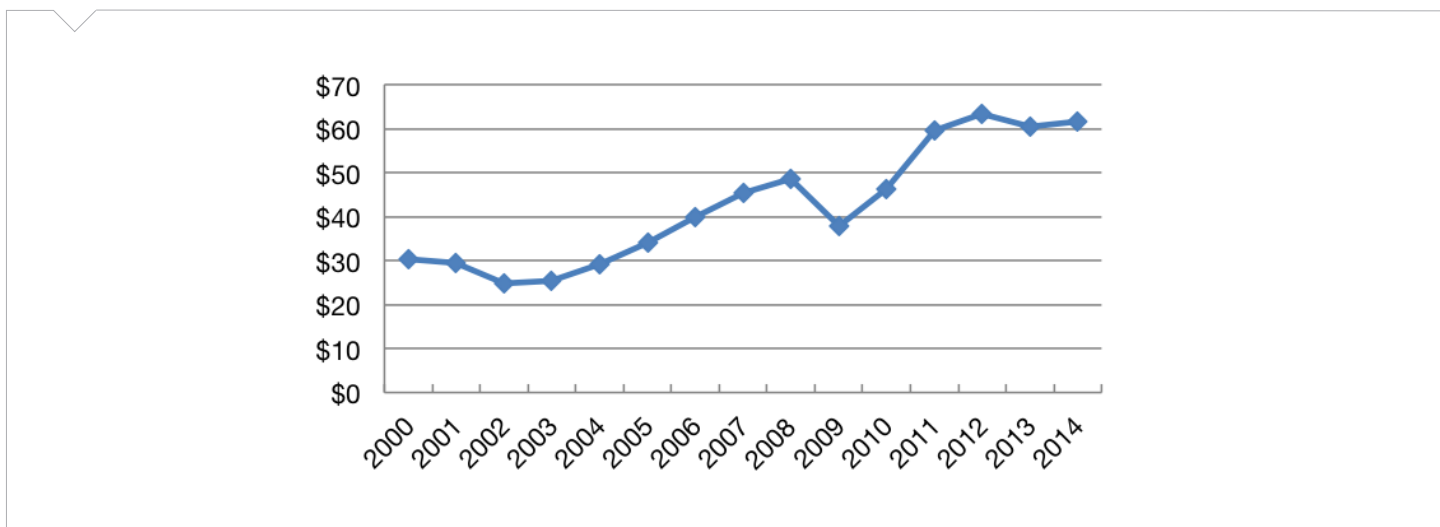

## Additional Trade Facts

- In 2014, manufacturers in the United States sold \$55.0 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$579.2 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
