

District of Columbia Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in District of Columbia account for 0.2 percent of the total output in the state, employing 0.2 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$0.27 billion in 2016. In addition, there were 1,200 manufacturing employees in District of Columbia in 2016, with an average annual compensation of \$70,065 in 2016.

Figure 1: District of Columbia Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2016

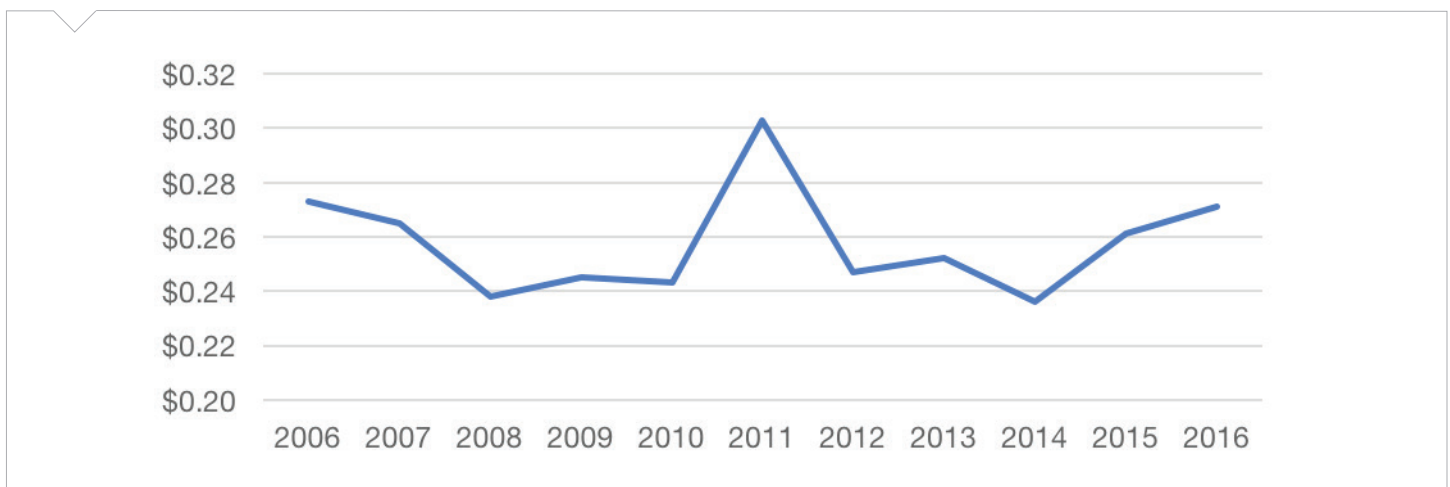


Figure 2: Top 10 District of Columbia Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2015



District of Columbia Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive the District of Columbia's economy, with \$1.24 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2016. That same year, \$0.17 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners.

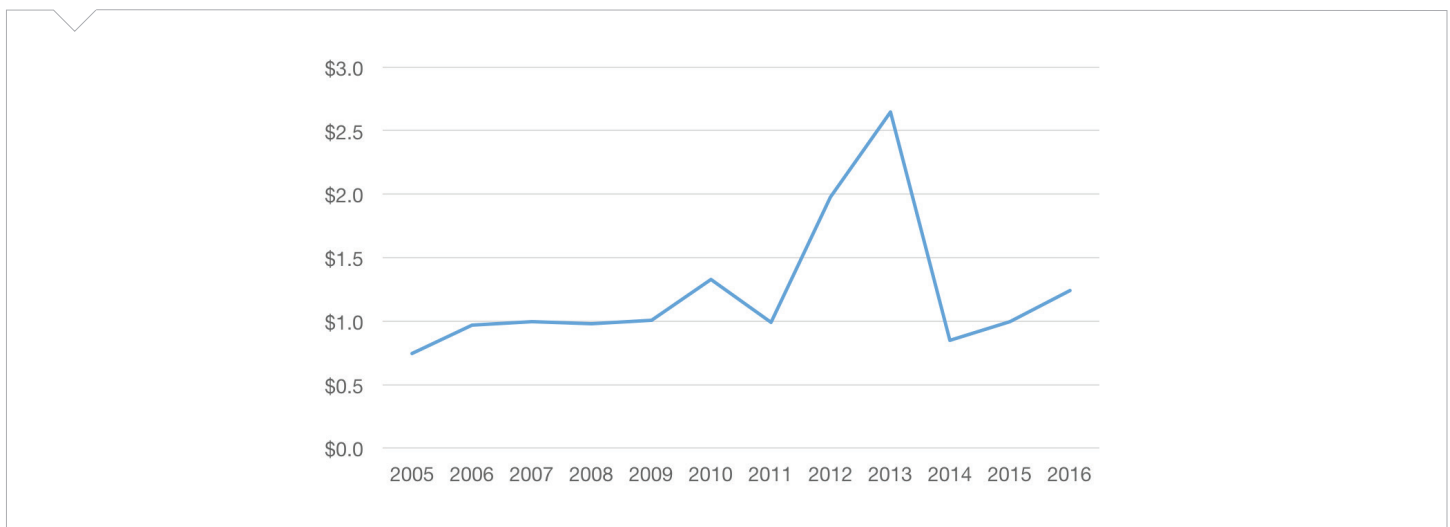

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$603 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2016 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
