

District of Columbia Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in District of Columbia account for 0.2 percent of the total output in the state, employing 0.2 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$0.29 billion in 2017. In addition, there were 1.2 manufacturing employees in District of Columbia in 2017, with an average annual compensation of \$70,065 in 2016.

Figure 1: District of Columbia Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2017

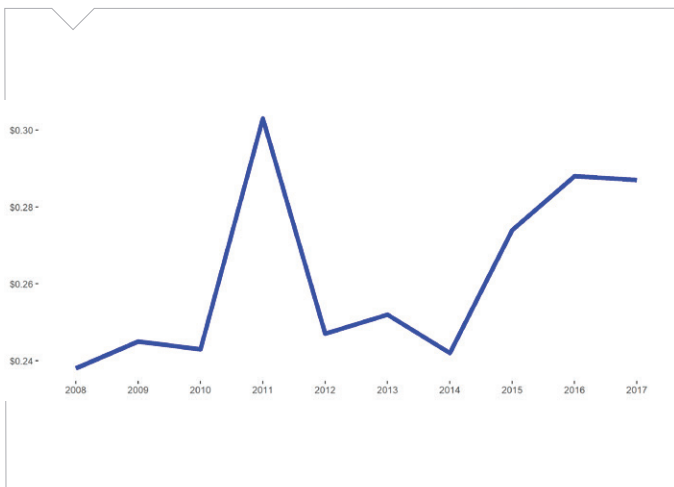


Figure 2: Top 10 D.C. Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2016

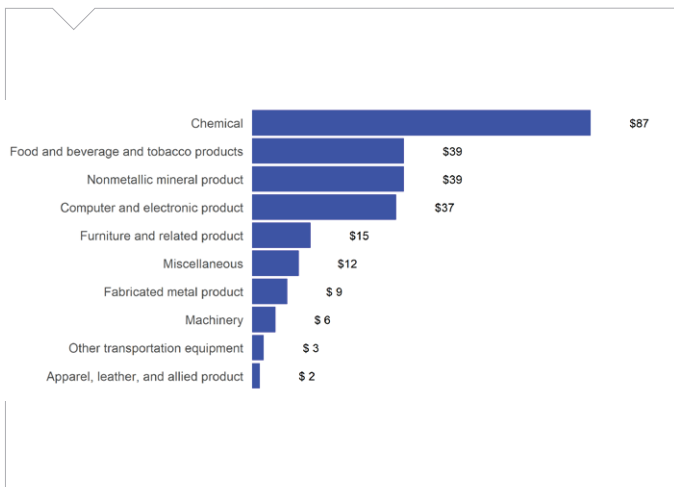
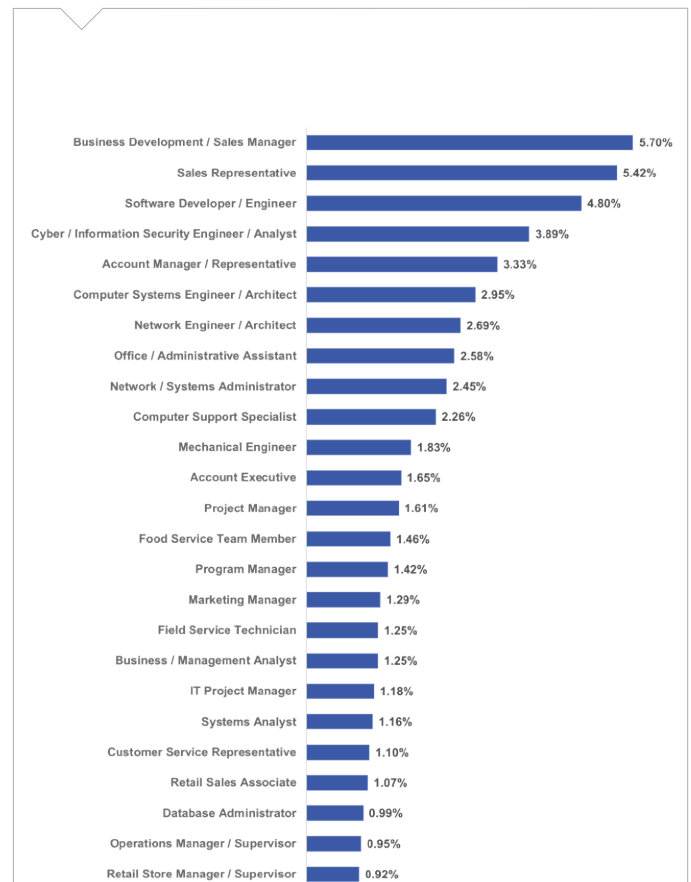


Figure 3: Top 25 Manufacturing Job Titles over the Past 12 Months in District of Columbia

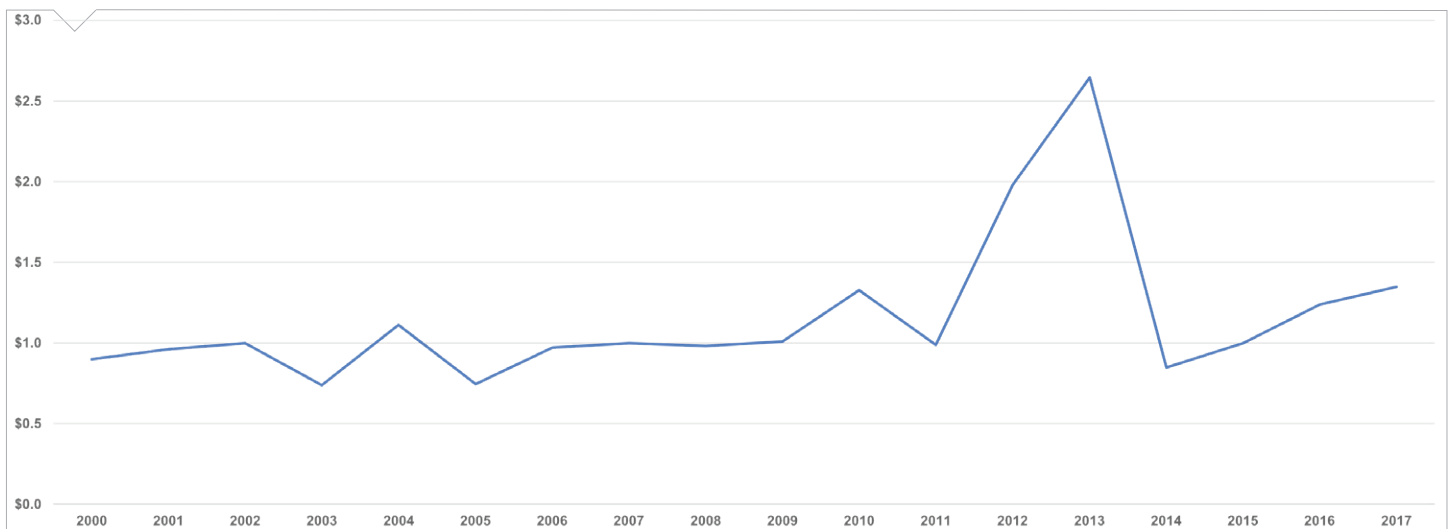
District of Columbia Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive District of Columbia's economy, with \$1.35 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2017. That same year, \$0.16 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and N/A percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised N/A percent of all exporters in District of Columbia.

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$637.5 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2017 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
