

North Carolina Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in North Carolina account for 19 percent of the total output in the state, employing 10.5 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$102.48 billion in 2017. In addition, there were 464.2 manufacturing employees in North Carolina in 2017, with an average annual compensation of \$68,975 in 2016.

Figure 1: North Carolina Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2017

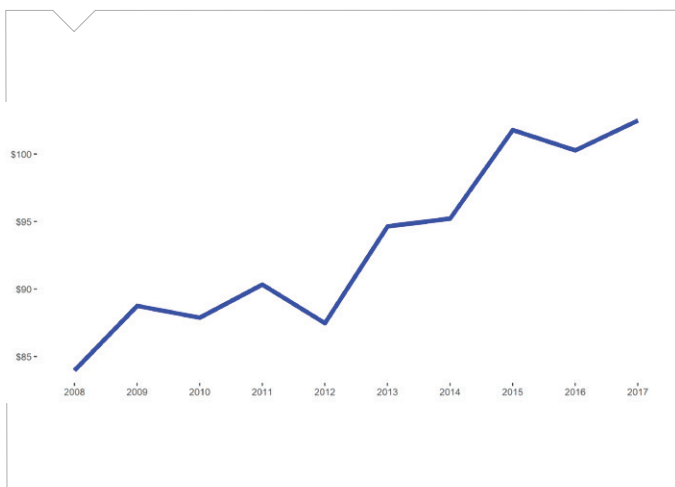


Figure 2: Top 10 North Carolina Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2016

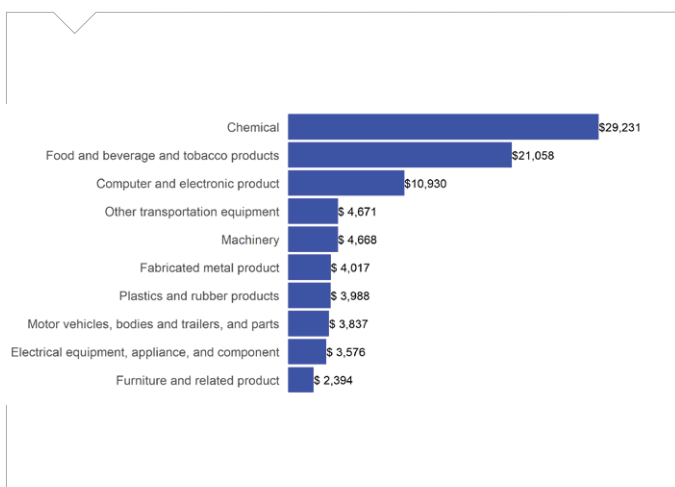
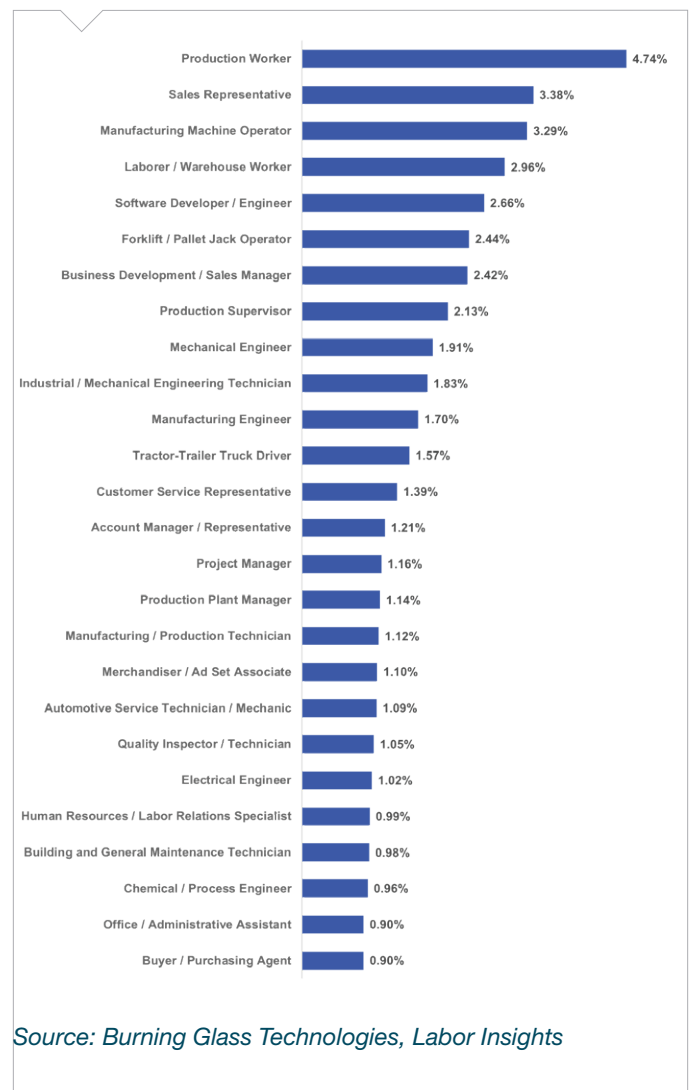


Figure 3: Top 25 Manufacturing Job Titles over the Past 12 Months in North Carolina

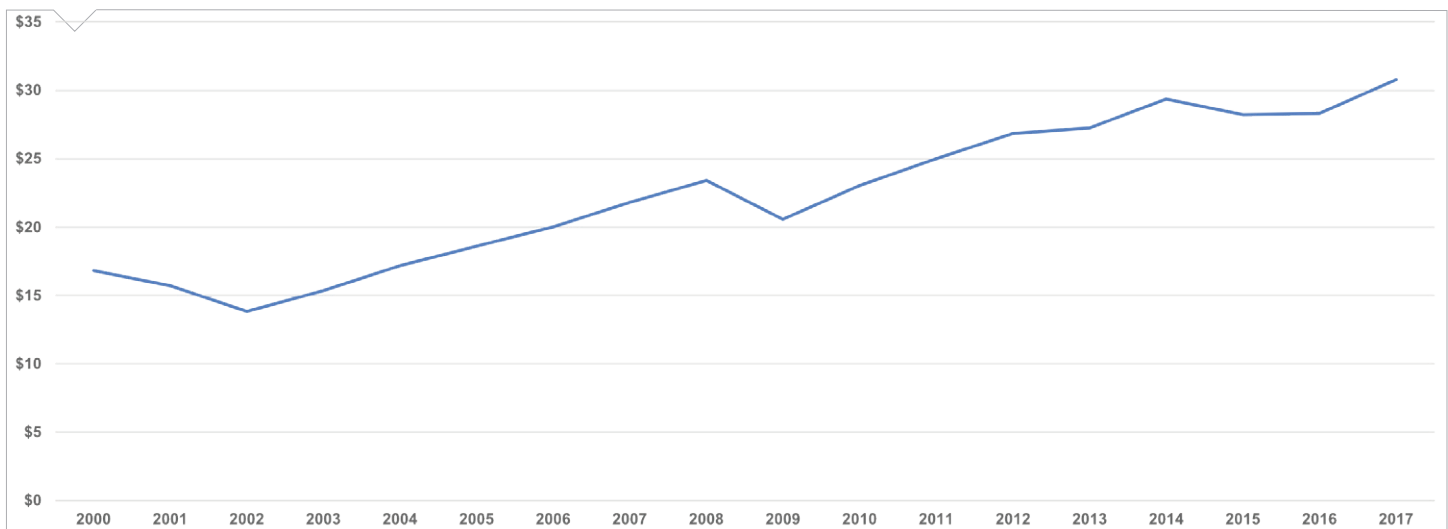
North Carolina Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive North Carolina's economy, with \$30.77 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2017. That same year, \$13.76 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 20.6 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 88 percent of all exporters in North Carolina.

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$637.5 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2017 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
