

# Oregon Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Oregon account for 21.8 percent of the total output in the state, employing 10.1 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$49.43 billion in 2016. In addition, there were 186,300 manufacturing employees in Oregon in 2016, with an average annual compensation of \$77,573 in 2016.

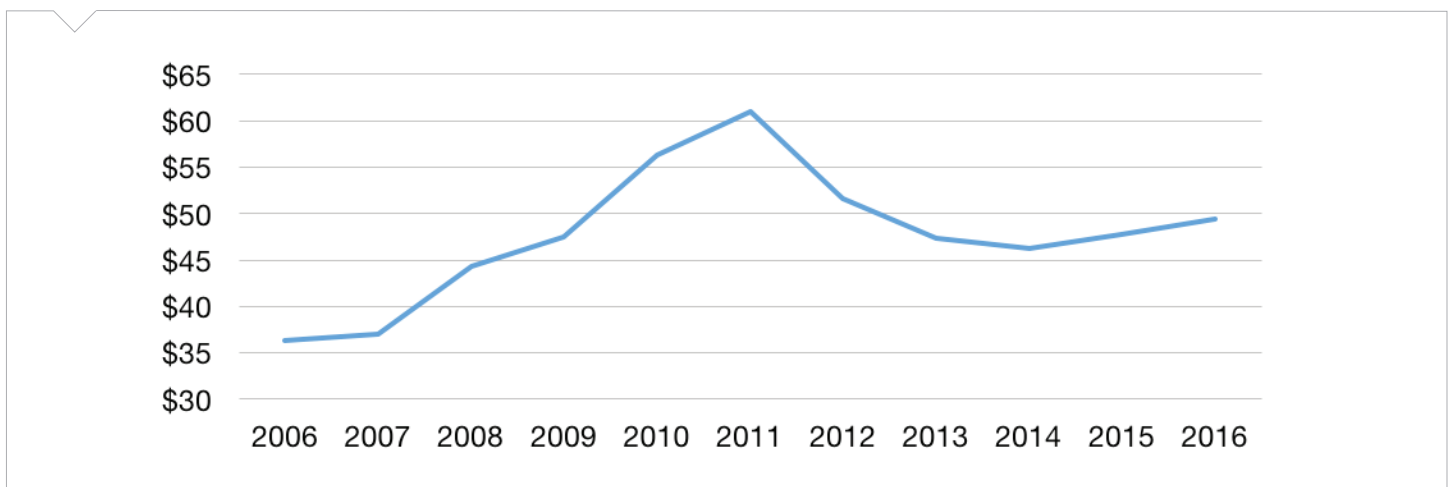

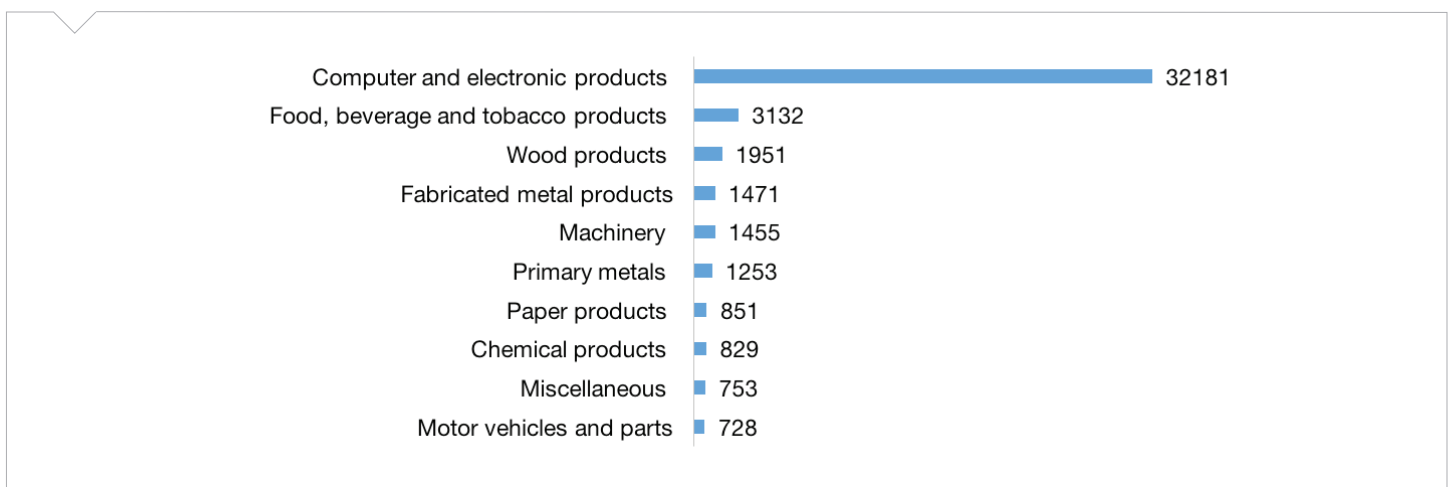

**Figure 2:** Top 10 Oregon Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2015



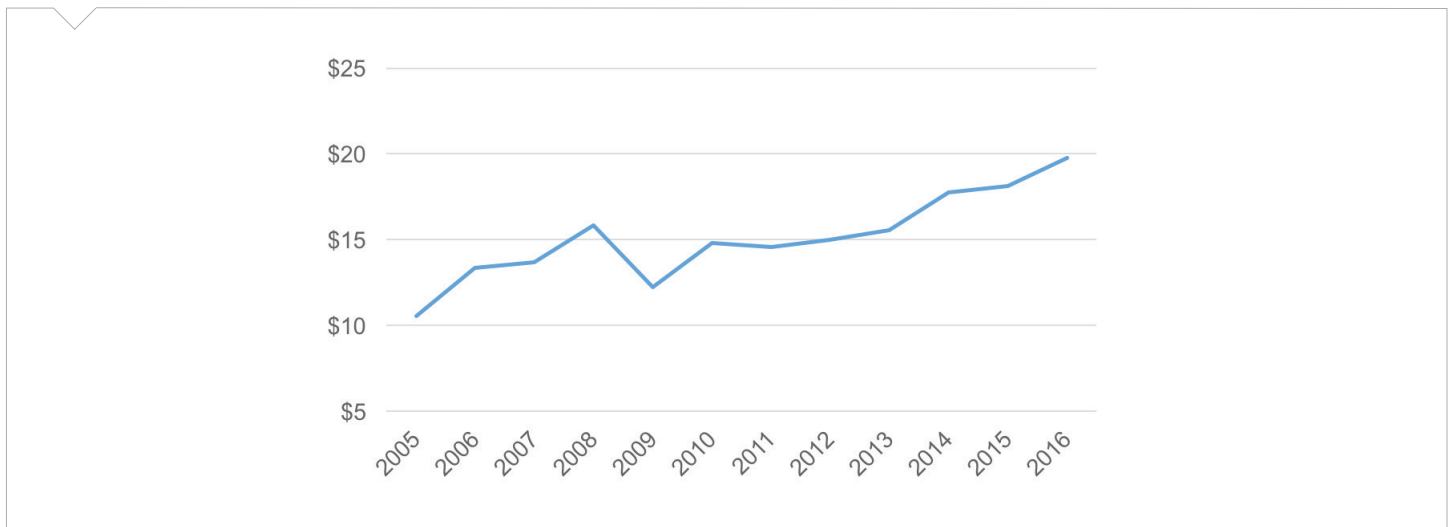
# Oregon Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Oregon's economy, with \$19.76 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2016. That same year, \$4.54 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 22 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 89 percent of all exporters in Oregon.

## Additional Trade Facts

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$603 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2016 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
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
