Iowa Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in lowa account for 18.3 percent of the total output in the state, employing 13.7 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$31.15 billion in 2014. In addition, there were 216,100 manufacturing employees in lowa in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$65,793 in 2014.

Figure 1: Iowa Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2000–2014





Figure 2: Top 10 Iowa Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2013




Iowa Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive lowa's economy, with \$11.24 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2015. That same year, \$6.20 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 24.5% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 82.7 percent of all exporters in lowa.

- In 2015, manufacturers in the United States sold \$12.7 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$639.6 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
