

Connecticut Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Connecticut account for 10.5 percent of the total output in the state, employing 9.5 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$27.22 billion in 2015. In addition, there were 160,700 manufacturing employees in Connecticut in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$95,118 in 2015.

Figure 1: Connecticut Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2015

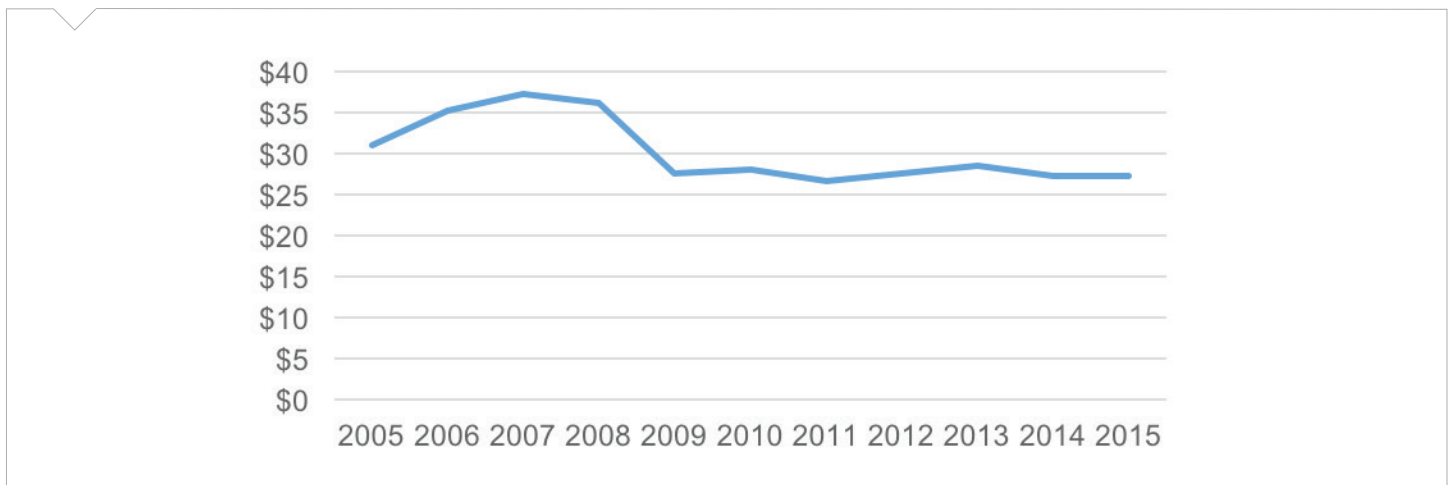
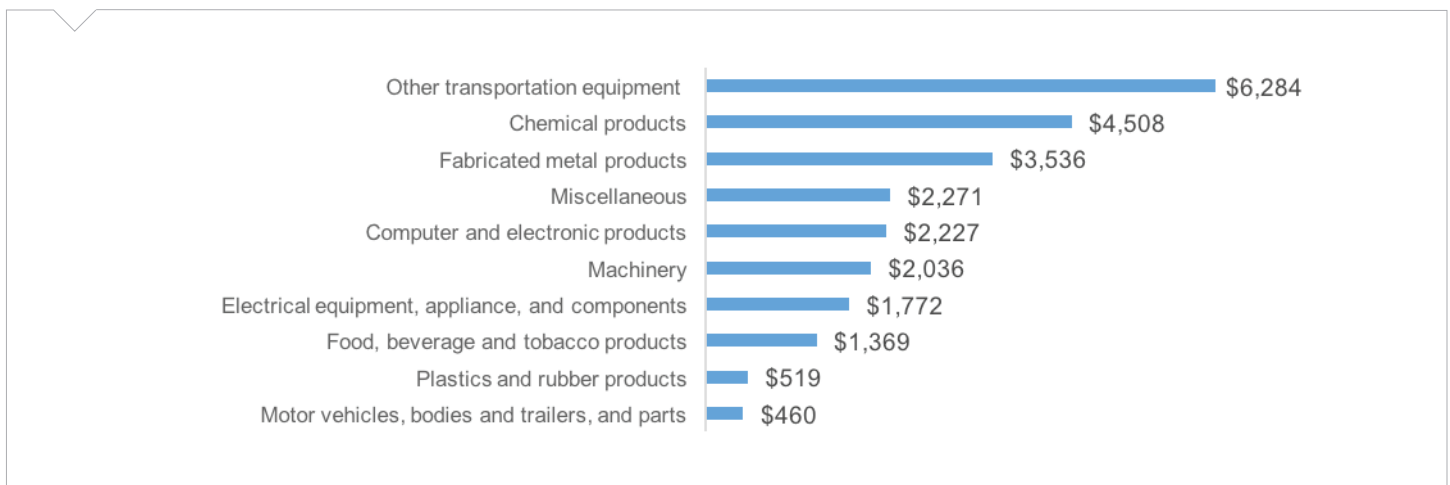


Figure 2: Top 10 Connecticut Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2014



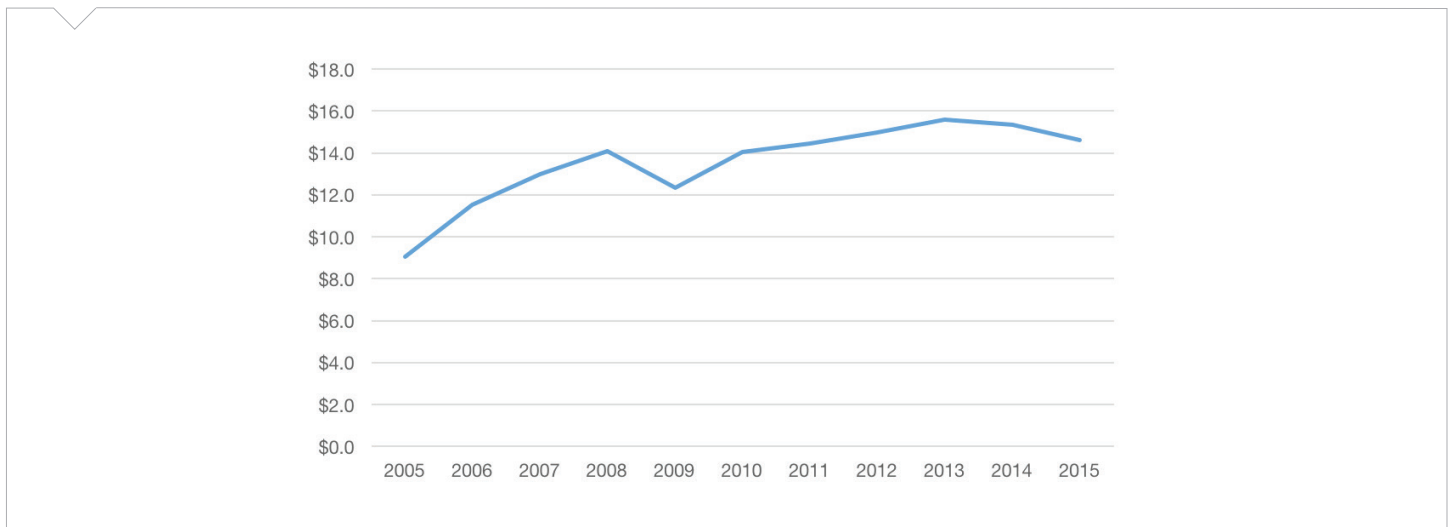
Connecticut Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Connecticut's economy, with \$14.63 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2015. That same year, \$4.00 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 27.40% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 88.8 percent of all exporters in Connecticut.

- In 2015, manufacturers in the United States sold \$12.7 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$639.6 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
