## **Rhode Island Manufacturing Facts**

Manufacturers in Rhode Island account for 8 percent of the total output in the state, employing 8.7 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$4.57 billion in 2015. In addition, there were 41,900 manufacturing employees in Rhode Island in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$69,796 in 2015.

Figure 1: Rhode Island Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2015





Figure 2: Top 10 Rhode Island Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2014




## **Rhode Island** Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Rhode Island's economy, with \$1.57 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2015. That same year, \$0.74 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 16.90% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 88.7 percent of all exporters in Rhode Island.

- In 2015, manufacturers in the United States sold \$12.7 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$639.6 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
