

Texas Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Texas account for 14.3 percent of the total output in the state, employing 7.3 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$227.46 billion in 2015. In addition, there were 866,700 manufacturing employees in Texas in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$82,460 in 2015.

Figure 1: Texas Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2015

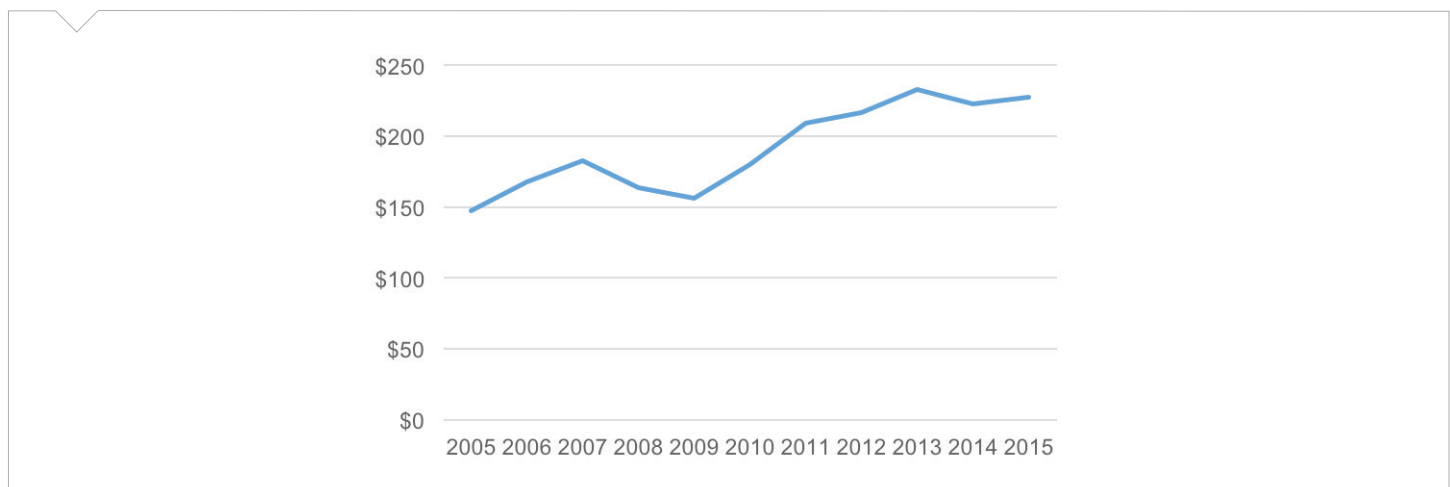
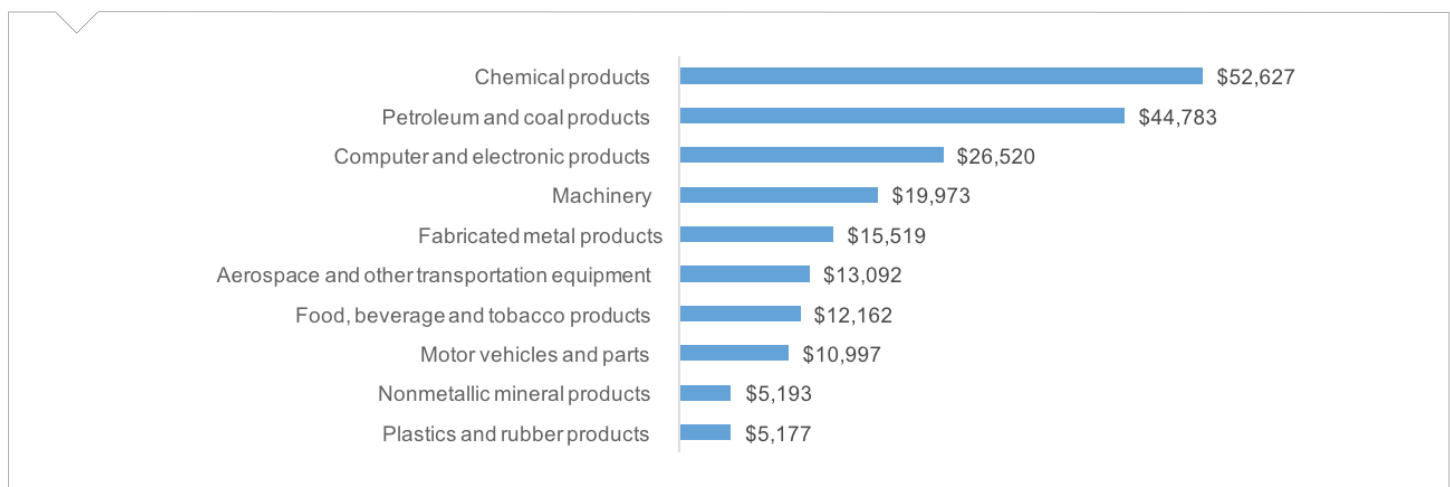


Figure 2: Top 10 Texas Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2014



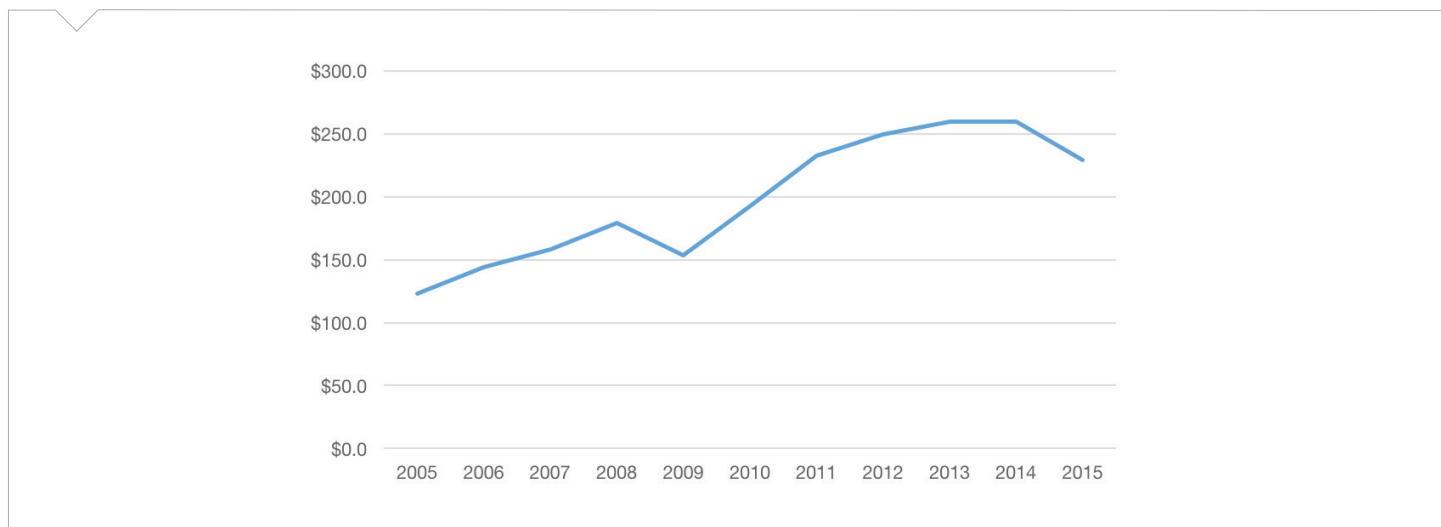
Texas Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Texas's economy, with \$229.18 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2015. That same year, \$143.10 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 26.10% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 93.1 percent of all exporters in Texas.

- In 2015, manufacturers in the United States sold \$12.7 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$639.6 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
