# **Washington** Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Washington account for 13.1 percent of the total output in the state, employing 9.2 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$58.22 billion in 2015. In addition, there were 292,200 manufacturing employees in Washington in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$86,991 in 2015.

Figure 1: Washington Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2015





Figure 2: Top 10 Washington Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2014




## **Washington** Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Washington's economy, with \$73.57 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2015. That same year, \$20.74 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 38.80% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 90 percent of all exporters in Washington.

- In 2015, manufacturers in the United States sold \$12.7 billion more in manufactured goods to our FTA partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$639.6 billion from countries where no FTAs existed.
