Criteria

- This award is open to all members of the House of Representatives and the Senate.
- Recognition will be given to those members of Congress whose voting records are 70 percent and above in support of the NAM's positions on Key Manufacturing Votes.
- Special classification in the 100 Percent Club will be given to legislators with a perfect NAM voting record.
- This award recognizes members of Congress who support a pro-growth, pro-manufacturing policy agenda. It is not an endorsement of any candidate or party.

Key Votes

- Key Manufacturing Votes for the 111th Congress reflect the pro-manufacturing agenda.
- These votes will be determined and approved in advance by executives representing small and large manufacturers who serve on the Key Vote Advisory Committee, in consultation with the NAM's staff.

- The NAM award features a beautiful depiction of Lady Freedom, the statue that rests atop the dome of the U.S. Capitol, etched in crystal.
