

# Washington Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Washington account for 11.6 percent of the total output in the state, employing 8.6 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$58.77 billion in 2017. In addition, there were 285.3 manufacturing employees in Washington in 2017, with an average annual compensation of \$87,818 in 2016.

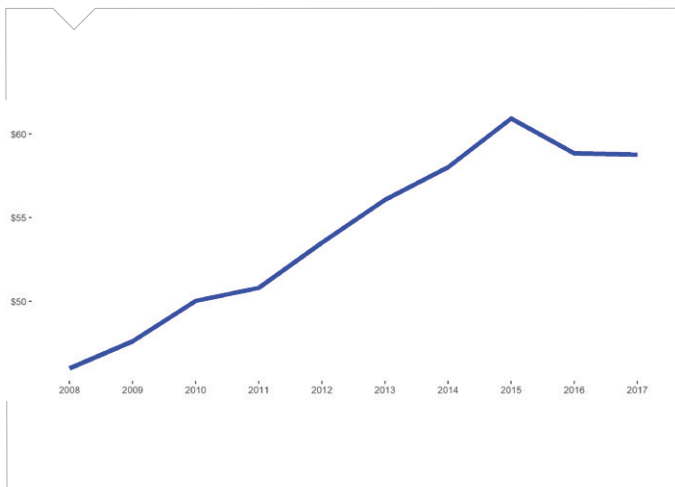

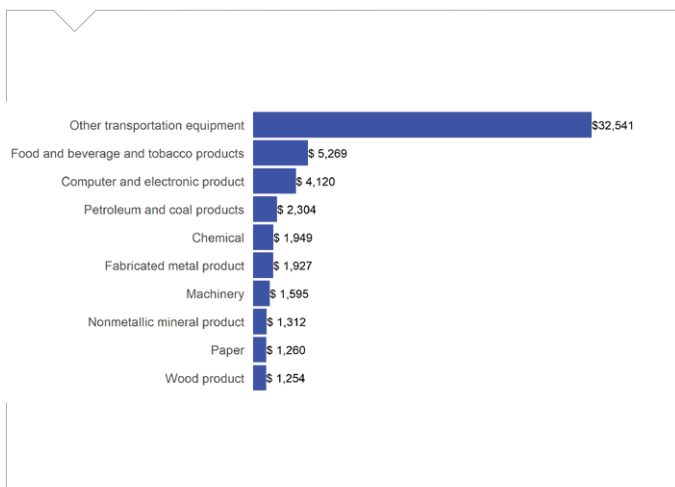

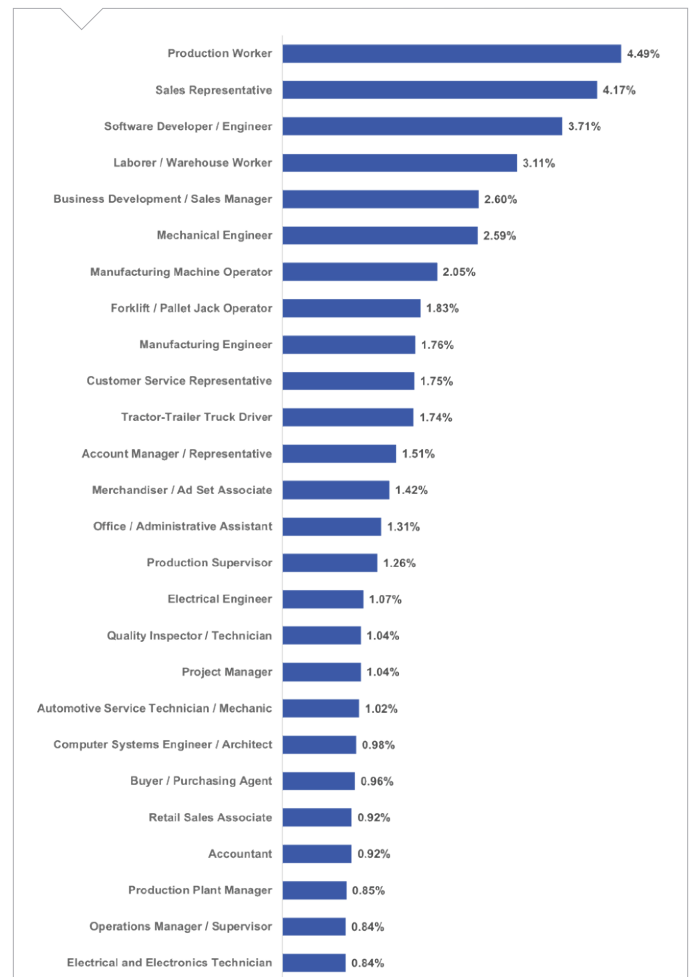
**Figure 1:** Washington Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2017

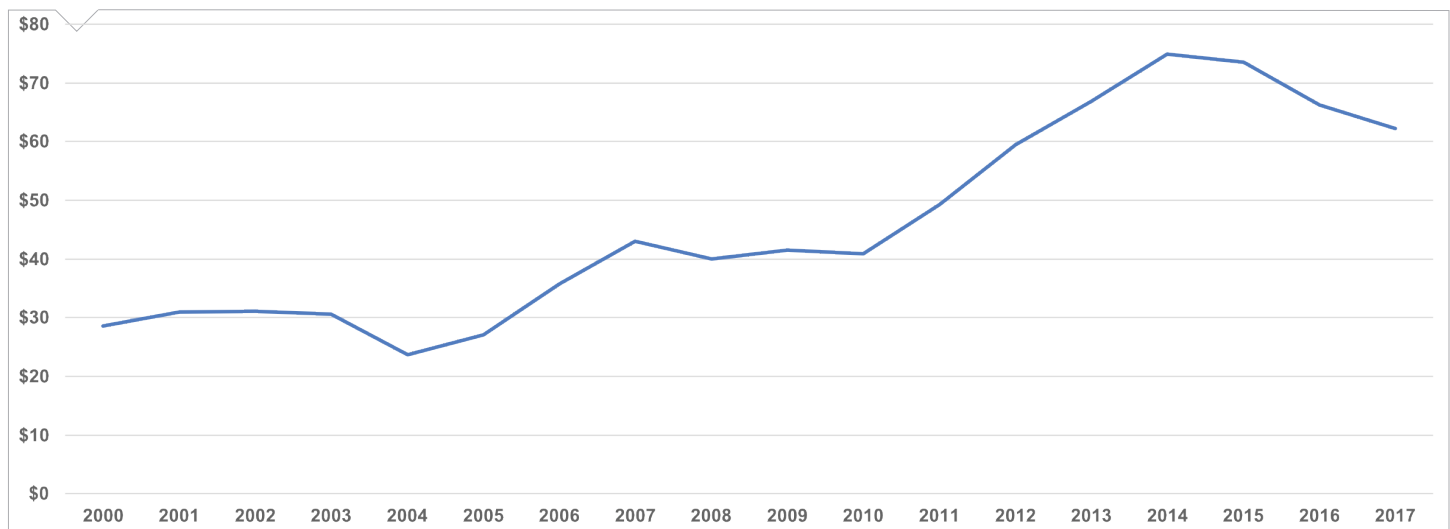
# Washington Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Washington's economy, with \$62.24 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2017. That same year, \$15.05 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 38.8 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 90 percent of all exporters in Washington.

## Additional Trade Facts

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$637.5 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2017 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
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
