Wisconsin Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Wisconsin account for 18.8 percent of the total output in the state, employing 16.4 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$55.07 billion in 2014. In addition, there were 472,800 manufacturing employees in Wisconsin in 2015, with an average annual compensation of \$67,833 in 2014.

Figure 1: Wisconsin Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2000-2014





Figure 2: Top 10 Wisconsin Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2013




Wisconsin Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Wisconsin's economy, with \$21.20 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2015. That same year, \$11.89 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 20.2% percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 87.2 percent of all exporters in Wisconsin.
