

# Alabama Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Alabama account for 17.3 percent of the total output in the state, employing 13.3 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$36.40 billion in 2017. In addition, there were 266,500 manufacturing employees in Alabama in 2017, with an average annual compensation of \$65,216 in 2016.

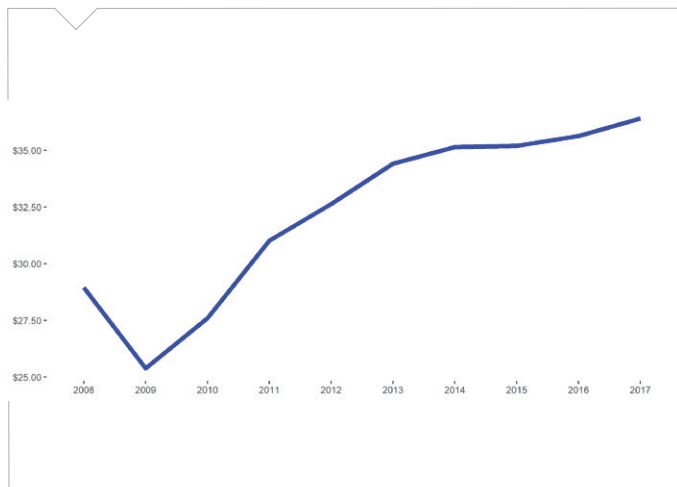

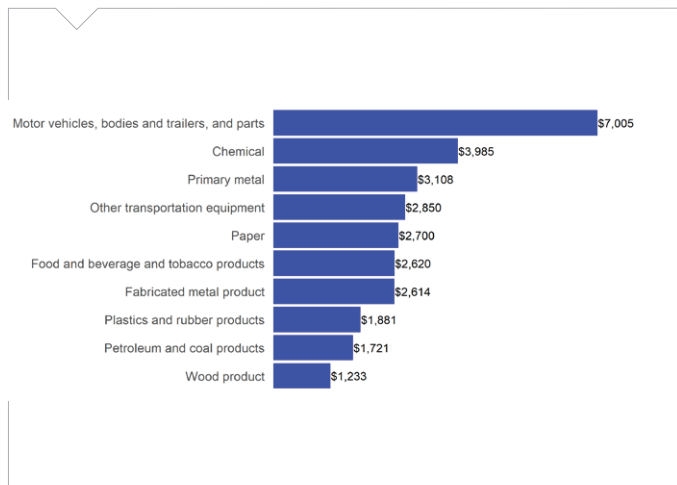

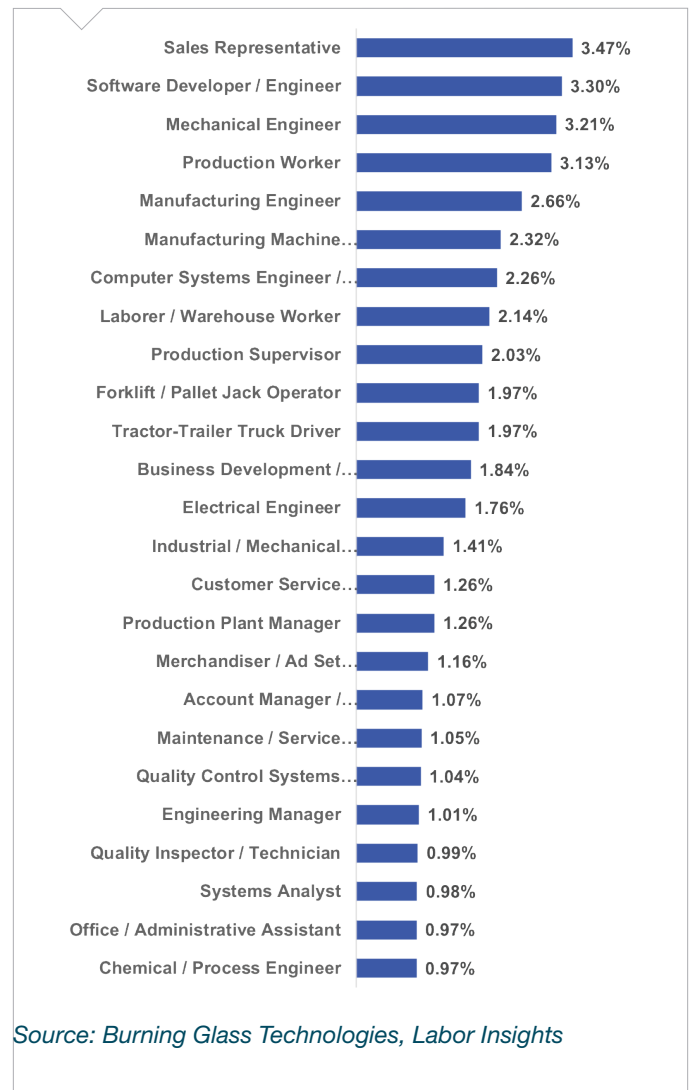
**Figure 1:** Alabama Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2017

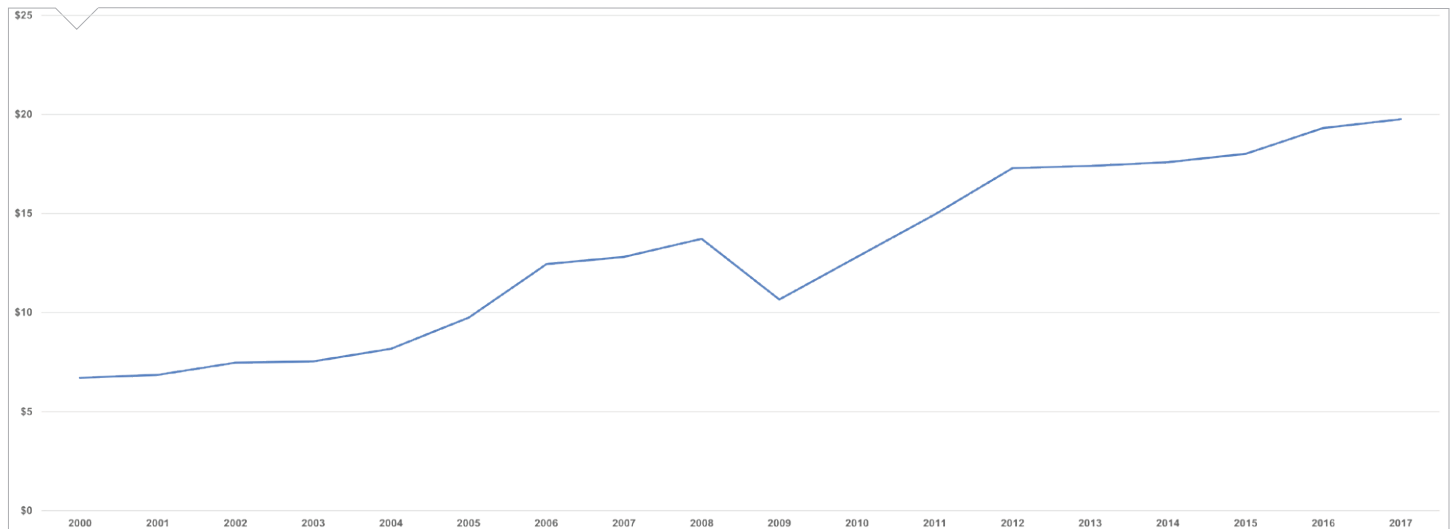
# Alabama Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Alabama's economy, with \$19.75 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2017. That same year, \$8.65 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 25.3 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 81 percent of all exporters in Alabama.

## Additional Trade Facts

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$637.5 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2017 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
