

# Tennessee Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Tennessee account for 16.1 percent of the total output in the state, employing 11.5 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$55.70 billion in 2017. In addition, there were 346,800 manufacturing employees in Tennessee in 2017, with an average annual compensation of \$69,260 in 2016.

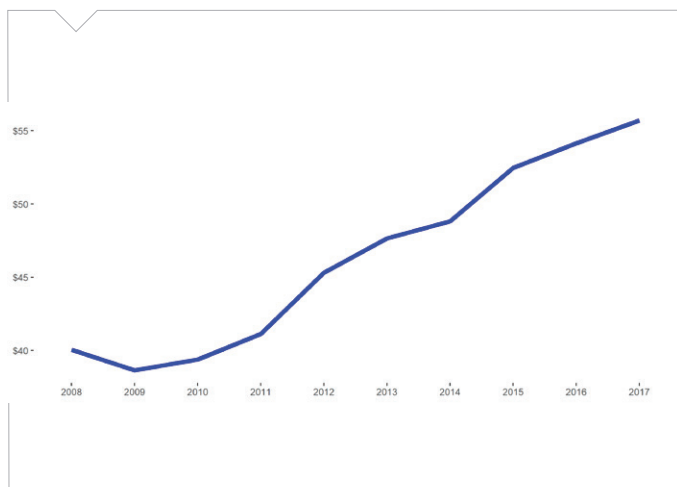

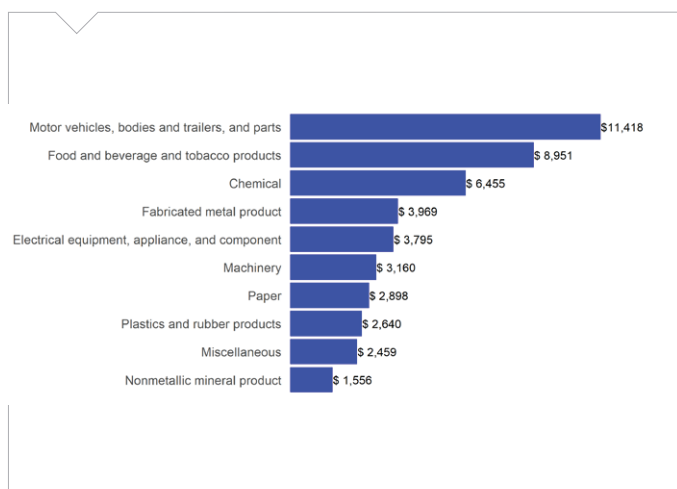

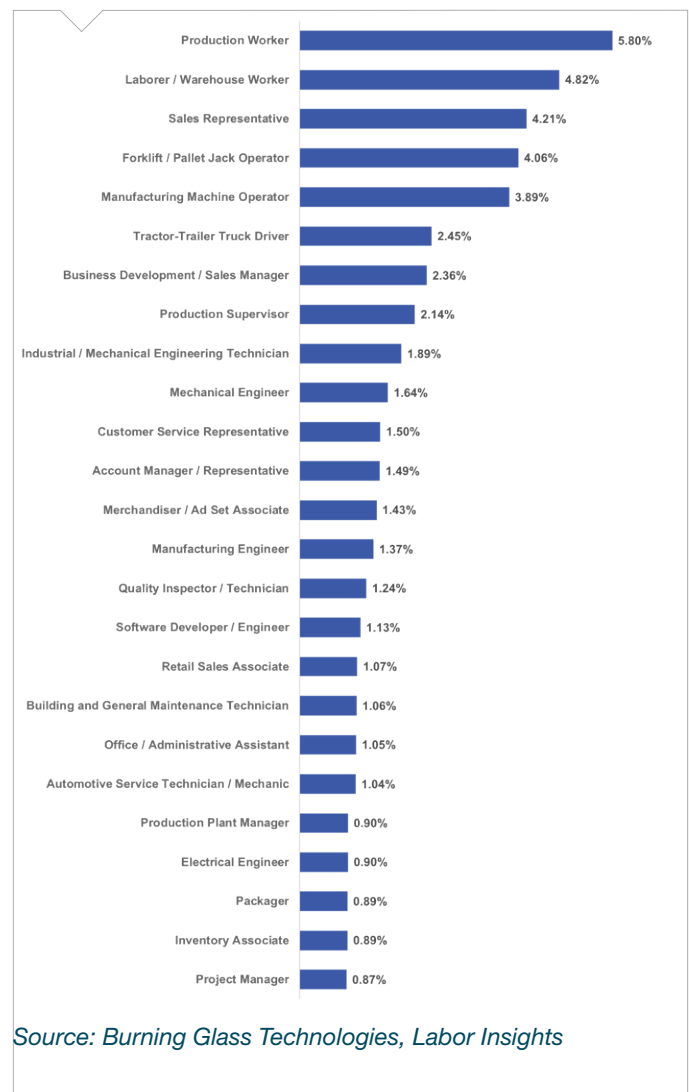
**Figure 1:** Tennessee Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2005–2017

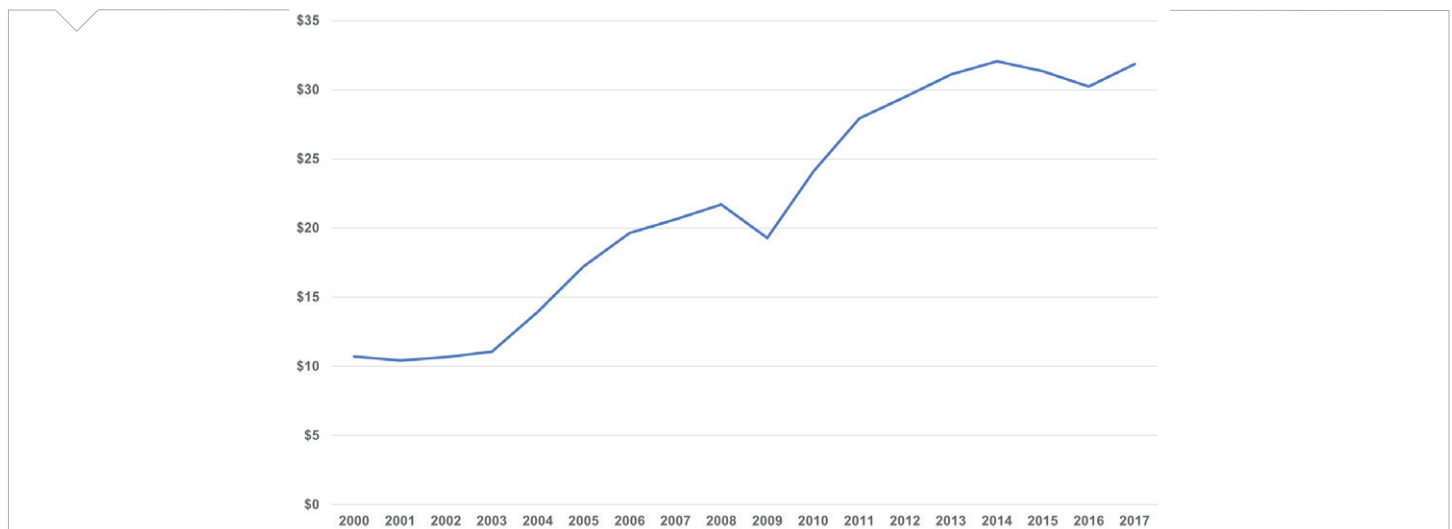
# Tennessee Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Tennessee's economy, with \$31.88 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2017. That same year, \$17.57 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 22.8 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 83 percent of all exporters in Tennessee.

## Additional Trade Facts

- The 20 U.S. FTA partners purchased nearly 48 percent (\$637.5 billion) of U.S. manufactured goods exports in 2017 – even though these countries represent only six percent of the world's population and 10 percent of GDP.
- FTA countries: Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Israel, Jordan, Mexico, Morocco, Nicaragua, Oman, Panama, Peru, Singapore and South Korea.
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
